PILIKIA OF MOORE

A Bluejacket's Arrest Causes Navy Men to Write.

A former seaman of the navy, William W. Moore, finds himself in a peculiar predicament in Honolulu. He has also found the inside of a cell.

Moore was a fireman, second-class, in the American Navy until recently. His term of service being about to expire while he was attached to the Asiatic fleet, he was sent home on the transport Sherman. While the vessel was here a month ago, or specifically, on October 19, Moore, among others, was arrested aboard the troopship on a charge of uttering counterfeit bank notes. He was removed from the vessel by the United States Marshal and placed in prison. A true indictment was found against him on October 27 by the Federal Grand Jury and his case will come to trial on November 21. Captain Niblack has received a request from the Navy Department at Washington to furnish information concerning Moore. The officer knew nothing about Moore until yesterday when he was officially advised by the Marshal that the man was in custody.

When Moore was removed from the transport he was merely designated as a "sailor." A "sailor" is not generally speaking the technical name by which a navy officer designates an enlisted man in the navy. He is a seaman, generally speaking, and for that reason the navy station knew nothing of Moore. When a man is placed under arrest his pay ceases. The officer in charge of the men failed to notify the naval authorities here that a seaman in the navy had been arrested by the civil authorities. This information will be forwarded to the navy authorities at Washington and the tangle will be unraveled from that end.


