WINNINGS OF GREAT HORSES

The mail brings news that the peerless English filly Pretty Polly had, to the end of the 1905 season, which closed last month, won £35,362, as a result of 29 victories, spread over less than 39 months. Large as this sum is it by no means stands as a record, for Isinglass, winner of the "Triple Crown" (Two Thousand Guineas Derby, and St. Leger) in 1892, won for Mr. H. McCalmont the wonderful amount of £58,385, the largest sum ever appropriated by a single racehorse on the turf. Donovan, the English Derby winner of 1889, had a brilliantly successful career, and in two seasons his owner gathered in £55,154 by his horse's successes. Carbine is, of course, the largest winner amongst Australasian-bred race horses, and 33 victories and nine places secured by Musket's best son were worth £29,476. Wakeful's winnings, acquired mainly as a result of 25 successes, reached £16,580; whilst Newhaven, who won both in Australia and England, retired from the turf as the winner of 19 races and £13,254 in prize money; and Abercorn's turf career made his owner richer by £12,828. Sysonby, the crack three-year-old of America, has also been a prolific stake winner. To date he has won 14 times in 15 races, the prize money falling to his owner totalling £37,000. Sysonby's turf career has not yet finished, and with a little luck he may seriously trouble the claim of Isinglass to be regarded as the record stake winner. A comparison of the winnings of some of the best-known thoroughbreds may be interesting, and is as follows:


