### KOREAN CONVERTS ENTERTAINED LAST NIGHT

The Korean Compound, corner of Beretania and Punchbowl, known heretofore as the North Pacific Institute lot, now used by the Methodists in their work among the Koreans under the superintendency of Rev. John W. Wadman, was last ablaze last evening with Korean lanterns and bright with gay bunting in celebrating the closing exercises of the school, which has been carried on for the past year with good success. Interesting exercises, consisting of recitations, dialogues, songs, etc., occupied the evening and were listened to with interest by the large audience present, among whom were quite a number of American citizens. Prizes were awarded the students who had made the best averages and promotions were announced of others who were graded up to higher classes. The visitors were invited, at the close, to refreshments served in an adjoining room. The successful work of this, the newest Oriental school to be established in Honolulu, is largely owing to the faithful assistance of Mrs. Wadman, Miss Morrison, Mrs. Yardley and others. The Koreans themselves have taken a great interest in the school and have contributed generously to its support.

of ammunition; just enough to carry it through an ordinary battle. And when that is gone it is helpless and is at the mercy of any ship that is afloat. We are expending today over a hundred millions of dollars a year for the navy. It is said among military men, although I am not a military man, that an army moves on its belly. That is to say that an army cannot move without its base of supply. And the navy is precisely in the same condition as the army. You cannot move a navy about and have it supplied without a merchant marine. Let me give an instance of the mighty Oregon, the greyhound of the two oceans. She sailed from the Pacific Coast down through the Pacific and through the straits, up through the Atlantic and arrived off Santiago in time to take part in that battle, the only battle, it might be said, that took place in the war with Spain, only after having had to put in for coal three times. Had it not been for this the battleship Oregon would have arrived off Santiago three months after the battle had been fought.

"Let me ask you for a moment whether we have any apprehension of danger from any of the nations of the earth. Is it China, with her civilization dormant for over a thousand years from the time of Confucius? Where are our probable enemies located? They are located on continental Europe. They are Great Britain, Germany, France, Sweden, Russia and Spain. Out of that number there are none worth discussing and that from the fact that the mother country whose interest has always been with us has formed a strong alliance with the American people.

"On behalf of an American Marine, I say let us all join hands together, Democrats and Republicans alike, for the upbuilding of vessels flying the glorious Stars and Stripes of the United States, for a merchant marine that will aid us in time of war, and that will extend our commerce in time of peace across all seas and to all countries."
