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

FIRST INFANTRY RIFLE PRACTISE

July Competition Shows Fine Improvement Over Last February Shoot.

Captain Thos. P. Cummins, adjutant 1st Regt., N. G. H., has made up the score sheet of the Territorial rifle competition held in July. Out of a total attendance of 180 there were 81 to win prizes in grades of marksmanship as shown in this summary:

The 180 who competed were those who had qualified in gallery practice, all others having been barred. Besides the bars appropriate to the respective grades coming to the winners, a prize of \$10 was hung up for each enlisted man gaining a place among the fifteen highest scorers. The following nine won this money prize:

Sergt. A. R. Phillips, Corp. Stone, Prvt. Luther A. Evans, Prvt. Eugene Duvauchelle, Sergt. Joe Ferreira, Prvt. Antonio Camillo, Sergt. Joe Gonveia, Sergt. Geo. Karratti and Prvt. Thos. Evans.
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CONDITIONS.
To be a marksman a man has to make not less than an average of 33 out of a possible 50 at 200, 300 and 500 yards.

To be a sharpshooter a man has to make not less than an average of 40 at 200, 300, 500 and 600 yards, firing ten shots a minute at 200 yards, and make a 50 per cent score in a skirmish run.

To be an expert rifleman the shooter has to make 40 points on each range of 200, 300, 500, 600 and 800 yards, not less than 35 at 1000 yards and 50 per cent in a skirmish run.

Last February in camp 400 men shot and only twenty-two marksmen qualified. Now after three months of practice seventy-one marksmen graduate out of 180 shooters, besides three expert riflemen and seven sharpshooters. It is not the brilliancy of individual scores that gratifies Col. Johnson, but the general advancement of the regiment in skill with the rifle.

THE NATIONAL CONTEST.
The twenty best men are now competing to decide which twelve of them shall form Hawaii's 1907 team at the national contest in Ohio. A good team for the short ranges is certain to go. It is at 1000 yards and on the skirmish line that weakness is to be feared, though perhaps there are many other military bodies in the same case. Capt. Coster and Sergt. Ferreira tied for the National Rifle Association's medal in the late contest. They shot off the tie, when Capt. Coster won out by a score of 62 to 57. The ranges were 200, 300 and 500 yards. Col. Johnson was barred from this match owing to his high score of 70 made last year.
