

COAL FOR PACIFIC FLEET.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., September 5.—According to steam coal experts, a revolution is impending in soft coal shipments from this and other Atlantic ports, due to the removal of the Atlantic battleship fleet to the Pacific Coast. In the first place, the belief is general that the fleet will go to the Pacific never to return. This means the shipment in the next few years of millions of tons of coal to Pacific ports for the use of the battleships. Necessarily this coal must go in ships from Eastern ports, as the railroad freight makes the price of coal delivered on the Pacific Coast almost prohibitive. The difference in the price of coal sent in steam and sailing vessels compared with that shipped by rail is \$6 to \$8 a ton, in favor of the former.

Recognizing the importance of the situation, John C. Brady, director of the department of wharves, docks and ferries of this city, has notified the government at Washington that ships desiring to load coal for United States war vessels will be given preference at this port. This means that the system prevailing for fifty years will be revolutionized, and that vessel owners who have heretofore dominated the docks on the Delaware river in Philadelphia will have to give way to ships carrying coal for the government.

The latest type of motor boat is reported to have made a speed of thirty-two miles an hour, exceeding that of the fastest torpedo boat in the United States navy. This has led to talk among naval officers as to the practicability of using motor boats in the navy. One officer suggests that such craft could be equipped with a single torpedo tube in the bow and might be effectively used as a kind of torpedo boat. He thinks that each first class battleship could be equipped with at least one motor boat, which could easily be carried on deck, and that in actual warfare, when circumstances warranted it, the motor torpedo boat could be lowered and sent against the enemy. Owing to the great speed and the size of the boat it might be able to get within range before being sunk. Other officers think that with some changes in the construction of this class of boats they might be used effectively as short distance dispatch boats.
