Governor Frear is to receive the members of the Keio and the Santa Clara baseball teams at the Capitol this forenoon.

The Keio baseball team were the guests at lunch yesterday at the Young Cafe of Edwin Fernandez and Fred K. Makino.

The Manoa Improvement Club has taken up the matter of dealing with estrays. A report on the law in relation to estrays has been made to the club.

A cable message received yesterday from Berkeley, Cal., says that Mr. and Mrs. Elston have become the parents of a daughter. Mother and child are doing nicely.

A successful gambling raid was made yesterday afternoon by Officers Ahi, Apana and Medeiros, nine paikau players being caught in an old joint on Hotel street.

The First Precinct of the Fourth Representative District will hold their meeting for the nomination of precinct officers at W. C. Roe's residence, Kalaheua avenue, Waikiki.

Governor Frear yesterday received calls from Commander Nelson of the Panther and Lieutenant Commander McVay, Jr., of the Yankton. Later he returned these calls and also the call of Commander Hogg of the Glacier.

On Friday, July 17, there will be another popular \$25 excursion to the volcano for the accommodation of the officers and men of the fleet. The party will return on Monday. Only a limited number of persons will be taken.

There is an exhibition in the rooms of the Promotion Committee a freak pineapple, which is attracting considerable attention. The pineapple is a conglomeration of about thirty small pines and weighs in the neighborhood of twenty pounds. It was grown by J. B. Dole of Wahiawa.

It is reported that at Keokea, Kula, Maui, there has been no rain since last November and the region and the people are suffering from drought. In a district five miles long and two miles wide, the only water supply is the Keokea government water tap, from which the water flows at the rate of about fifteen gallons an hour.

The directors of Oahu Sugar Company yesterday voted to increase the regular monthly dividend from one and a half per cent. to two per cent. It is probable that in addition to this, special additional dividends of one and a half per cent. will be paid October 15 and December 15. It was rather expected that the regular monthly dividend would be made two and a half per cent.


