MANDAMUS CASE NOW SUBMITTED

The Argument Is Concluded Before Supreme Court.

The Supreme Court may hand down a decision in the municipal mandamus case today. Argument was made yesterday and the case submitted. W. A. Kinney argued the case of Treasurer Trent, E. M. Watson being the associate counsel. The main contention of Kinney was based on the appointive power of the Mayor as given by the charter.

Stayton Fined. John T. Stayton, late assistant postmaster of Honolulu, who pleaded guilty to an indictment charging him with opening official mail, escaped with a fine of \$100 in the United States District Court yesterday.

Owing to the fact that the attorneys were detained in the Supreme Court the Atcherley trial was postponed in Judge Lindsay's department of the Circuit Court yesterday. The trial will be resumed today.
