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Around the Police Station

If a man levels a Winchester rifle at you, using angry language directed at you at the same time, would you stop to consider whether the gun was loaded or not loaded? The prosecution in the case of the Territory vs. August Herring made just such an inquiry before Judge Andrade in police court yesterday afternoon during argument. The charge against August Herring is that he pointed a rifle at a Chinaman with whom he had had a quarrel. The Chinaman had Herring arrested and charged with using a weapon on him "imminently dangerous to life." Attorney Rawlins for the defendant, Herring, had moved for the discharge of his client on the ground that it had not been proven by the prosecution that the gun was loaded. He called attention to a case in point, and the judge commented on this particular case. The sum and substance of the point at issue was that perhaps after all a gun is not "obviously and imminently dangerous to life" unless it is proven to be in shape to fire.

Senator Chillingworth for the prosecution said that under such circumstances an angry man could walk down Fort street with a Winchester rifle and point it at a man, yelling that he was going to shoot, and yet not shoot. Under the circumstances there would be no remedy at law, unless it was proven that the gun was loaded. However, Judge Andrade in stating that he would take the matter under advisement for a few days, said that it is a serious business for any man to use a gun in a community and is a serious matter for any man to be drawing a gun and flourishing it. August Herring has a record already for using firearms on a people.

Youthful Fagins Up. A number of boys of various nationalities were up before the magistrate yesterday morning on charge of larceny, and the goods piled up in front of Court Officer Weed indicated that their operations had been thorough, although they only extended over a day or two. The boys were Wah Guan, Frank Sinehi, Chas. Kabele, Francisco Frank, Jos. Solomon, of one gang, and Katsu and Tarao, two boys caught stealing afternoon papers from the premises of a prominent resident of the Makiki district. One boy did not show up. Judge Andrade ordered that he be sent for and that a couple of policemen undertake the job of locating him, and even to use the entire police force if necessary. The cases went over for a day.

Told by the Marines. Several marines called at the police station a few nights since and inquired if the police had heard that one of their number had been cut up by an irate husband. The police knew of no such occurrence. The marines said that the marine had not shown up at Camp Very and they were alarmed. The police located the husband mentioned easily enough and held him at the station while the story was investigated. The man laughed at the charge that he had carried the marine. Yesterday morning the man's wife was taken to the station, and then a little later information came from the marine camp that the supposed-to-be-carved-up man was in camp again, quite healthy and unslashed, and had been missing from the post only because he was out on a lark.
