



## CHAPMAN-ALEXANDER MEETINGS FRIDAY

Arrived at the wharf a number of privately owned automobiles are promised to take the party around the city. They will be brought to Central Union church in time for the 4 p. m. meeting. If these whistles blow before 3 p. m. all may know that there will be a 4 p. m. meeting. If they blow after 3 p. m. the public will infer that only the evening meeting will be held. If Central Union church is crowded there will be an overflow meeting in the Methodist church and if this also fills up the Christian church will be used. Let the whole town turn out.
