BIG SHIPMENTS OF SUGAR SOON

American-Hawaiian Company to Carry Away 36,000 Tons Shortly.

Between now and the third of July, the American-Hawaiian Steamship Company will have three steamers here that will carry away in all the great amount of 36,000 tons of Hawaiian sugar.

The first steamer of the American-Hawaiian line due here from the mainland is the Mexican, which should arrive from Seattle this morning.

The Missouriian, advertised to sail June 24 from Seattle and Tacoma for Honolulu direct, has been withdrawn.
