# EXTENSION IS NOW FINANCED

## Money Ready for the New Branch of the Hilo Railroad.

The financing of the Hakalau extension of the Hilo railroad is now an accomplished fact, the necessary transactions having been accomplished by B. F. Dillingham, the financial constructing agent, through his brokers, J. F. Morgan and the Waterhouse Trust Co., Ltd. Out of the \$80,000 bond issue authorized, \$250,000 worth of bonds have already been disposed of and the money paid in. The sale of the remainder of the bonds is virtually arranged for, agreements having been made with various persons to take \$100,000 worth. The remaining \$550,000 worth of bonds will be placed on the market soon and it is expected that they will be eagerly taken up.

The amount which it is estimated will be expended in the extension of the road is about \$750,000. This, however, includes not only the cost of construction work, but also the purchase of rolling stock and other necessary equipment.

Arrangements have been completed for going on with the actual work of construction almost immediately and the dirt will begin to fly within the next month. C. H. Kluegel, as stated elsewhere, has accepted the position of Chief Engineer of the Hilo Railroad Company and of the O. R. & L., and he will be in charge of the work of extending the Hilo railroad. His assistant will be R. S. Sisson.

The actual work of grading will probably be done by contract. It is expected that A. A. Wilson will be the contractor. Mr. Wilson is now constructing the two branches of the Oahu railroad at Wahiawa, but he will probably be through with that work within the next thirty days and ready to begin operations on the Hakalau extension.

Detailed surveys giving the location, size and length of bridges and culverts to be constructed have already been made and this will greatly expedite the work. It has been finally decided to reduce by fully half, the number of steel bridges originally thought to be necessary. Concrete culverts and heavy cuts and fills will be substituted, not only greatly reducing the expense but also straightening the line.

The maximum grade of the line to Hakalau as now designed is 1.1 per cent—which means that the track will virtually be level.

The following is the agreement signed by the subscribers to the bond issue:

We, the undersigned, hereby agree with B. F. Dillingham, Financial and Constructing Agent of the Hilo Railroad Company, and each with the other, that we will take the amount of six per cent 10-20 year bonds of said Hilo Railroad Company set opposite our respective names, on the following terms and conditions, to wit:

1st. Bonds to be issued in accordance with the general terms and conditions set forth in a prospectus issued by said B. F. Dillingham, dated January 1, 1909.

2nd. Bonds to be paid for at 95 per cent of their face value in four quarterly instalments beginning with July 1, 1909, or earlier at subscriber's option. Interest at the rate of 6 per cent per annum will be allowed from the date of each payment, upon the amount so paid.

3rd. The undersigned to receive a commission in common stock of said Hilo Railroad Company, fully paid up, and equal to 15 per cent of the par value of the bonds hereby subscribed for, respectively.

4th. The said bonds shall be delivered not later than September 1, 1909, pending which scrip will be issued, if desired.

5th. The undersigned further agree that for a period of one year from July 1, 1909, none of the bonds hereby subscribed for shall be sold to others for less than 95 per cent of their par value.

### MAY NOT SEEK REELECTION.

There is more than a possibility that, when election time again comes around there will be a new candidate for Delegate to Congress on the Republican ticket. Though Kuhio is not yet ready to make a definite statement to the effect that he will decline to be a candidate for reelection, he admits that he is by no means certain that he cares to spend another term at Washington.

Business interests, partly in connection with the Kapiolani Estate, require rather more attention than he is able to give them at long range, and he is considering the advisability of retiring wholly from public life.

When asked concerning the report, Delegate Kuhio said: "I am considering the matter seriously, and may conclude to retire, but I have not arrived at any definite decision as yet."

But there are those, supposedly in the confidence of the Delegate, who are sure that he will decide to allow his name to be put up for election again. At any rate, the would-bees are beginning to look wise.


