Weekly Weather Bulletin

For the Week Ended Sept. 25, 1909. Honolulu, T. H., Sept. 27, 1909. GENERAL SUMMARY.

More rain fell than during the preceding week generally over the Island of Hawaii, and conditions were slightly ameliorated in the drought affected sections. On Maui and Oahu conditions were practically unchanged.

The following are the departures from the average, in inches, in the several islands and districts: Hawaii—N. Kohala +0.92 to +1.68, Hamakua -0.29 to -0.50, N. Hilo -0.07 to +0.64, S. Hilo -0.84 to +0.02, Puna -0.22, Kau -0.49 and -0.50, and N. Kona +0.39; Maui—Makawao -0.35; Oahu—Koolauloa -0.31, Koolanoko -0.15 to -0.42, Hialeah +0.11, Ewa -0.13, and Waianae -0.20; and Kauai—Hanalei -0.39, Koloa -0.42, and Waimea -0.20.

The following are the total amounts of rainfall, in inches, during the week in the several districts: Hawaii—N. Kohala 1.52 to 2.08, Hamakua 0.29 to 0.48, N. Hilo 2.05 to 2.90, S. Hilo 1.92 to 3.72, Puna 1.51 to 1.65, Kau 0.04 to 1.16, S. Kona 2.05, and N. Kona 1.44; Maui—Makawao 0.69 to 2.10, Hana 0.70 to 2.15, and the remaining districts 0.00 to 0.06; Oahu—Koolauloa 0.24, Koolanoko 0.27 to 0.85, Honolulu 0.39, Ewa 0.09, and Waianae 0.09; Kauai—Hanalei 0.65, Kawaihau 1.20, Lihue 0.19, Koloa 0.15 to 0.46, and Waimea 0.02; and Molokai—Molokai 0.00.

It was slightly warmer generally in the S. Hilo and Kau districts of Hawaii, the Makawao and Labaina districts of Oahu, the Waimea district of Kauai, and the Molokai district of Molokai; elsewhere it was generally slightly cooler.

Weather Bureau in Honolulu partly cloudy weather obtained, with measurable rainfall on five dates totaling 0.39 inch, 0.11 above the normal for the week and 0.19 more than during the preceding week. The maximum temperature was 82 deg., minimum 70 deg., and mean 76.4 deg., 1.5 deg. below the weekly normal, and 0.6 deg. lower than last week's. The mean daily relative humidity varied from 84 per cent to 66 per cent, and the mean for the week was 72.1 per cent. North-easterly winds prevailed on four days, and easterly on the remaining with an average hourly velocity of 9.3 miles. The mean daily barometer ranged from 30.05 to 30.10 inches, and the mean for the week, 30.08, was 0.11 inch above normal.
