HOLE ORDINANCE IS A HOLDUP

George R. Carter So Designates Proposed Act of the Supervisors.

"If the people of Honolulu want to wait six months extra for a telephone system, all right, we can stand it." The statement was made yesterday by ex-Governor George R. Carter, in reference to the proposed ordinance to charge the telephone company a dollar a hole for all the holes it may dig in the streets of Honolulu.

"It is only a hold-up scheme," said Mr. Carter. "We saw the Supervisors and arranged everything with them and thought everything was satisfactorily settled. And then this ordinance was proposed. I don't know what the Supervisors want, but they want something. It's all right, if the people want to wait six months for a lawsuit to be tried, but it is going to delay the installation of the new system."

The ex-Governor made the statement that the Supervisors had proposed to the company that if the ordinance were passed they would reduce the price per hole to fifty cents, if the company would put in a new duct for them. But the new duct would cost more than the dollar-a-hole proposition. So far as the cost of the holes is concerned, that, according to Mr. Carter, is not considerable. It would probably be less than one hundred dollars a year. But it is the principle of the thing, the question of who owns the streets—the City and County or the Territory. And it is this question that must be settled if the Supervisors pass the dollar-a-hole ordinance.

JURY AT THE MOANA.

(Continued From Page One.)
A room was secured, and the jurors were taken out to the beach. In case a verdict shall have been arrived at during the night, it will be made public this morning at 8 o'clock.

When the lengthening shadows made artificial light necessary last night, the jury members were confronted by a new problem; there were no lights in the court house. Chester Doyle was called upon to solve the problem. He hastened forth and purchased two dozen candles, which did very well until it was decided to adjourn to a hotel for the night.

The second riot trial has consumed but fourteen days in all, including the three days spent in selecting a jury, and nearly the whole of one day which was lost on account of the illness of one of the defendants. The first trial took twenty-four days. Virtually the same evidence was put on in each case, but the manner of its presentation differed considerably. Much time was lost in the first trial through the constant squabbling of counsel, whereas in the last trial there has been almost an entire absence of this.

The presentation of evidence was concluded last Friday morning, both sides resting then, and the remainder of the day was taken up with the preparation of the instructions to the jury. Yesterday morning the case was argued, County Attorney Cathcart and Attorney Prosser for the prosecution consuming an hour each, and Attorney Lightfoot for the defense taking two hours.
