**KILOHANA LEAGUE HOLDS MEETING**  
 Reports for Two Years Show the Finance in Good Shape.

There will be no diminishment in the activities of the Kilohana Art League, and the members plan to make the organization a factor even more important to the community than it is at the present time.

The annual meeting for the year 1909, and the postponed annual meeting for the year 1908, were held yesterday afternoon in the rooms of the league on Beretania street, and officers were elected to serve through the coming twelvemonth.

One of the most encouraging features of the meeting was the report of the treasurer for the year just passed. The report shows that income and donations for the year amounted to more than \$3000. This sum not only met all running expenses during the year, but cut the league's indebtedness from \$1547 to \$605.

The league's lease on its present quarters runs well into 1911 and the structure has been repaired so that it is in thoroughly safe and usable condition.

In the election of officers, it was necessary to choose three trustees to fill vacancies caused by death or resignation. Richard Cooke was unanimously elected to fill the vacancy caused by the death of the late C. M. Cooke, while the vacancies caused by the resignations of A. McIntosh and Frank Atherton were filled by the election of C. H. Atherton and Carl Du Roi.

Officers re-elected are: D. H. Hitchcock, president; Mrs. A. B. Tucker, vice president; Mrs. Lillian G. Marshall, secretary; Mrs. W. C. Weedon, treasurer; B. F. Dillingham, managing trustee, A. Gartley and E. A. Mott-Smith, trustees.

**SCOTT LOSES CASE IN SUPREME COURT**

The Supreme Court handed down an opinion overruling the exceptions of the plaintiff in the case of M. F. Scott vs. Joe Maria alias Joe Maria Pedro.

The original action was a suit on a note. The trial judge concluded that the action was barred by the statute of limitations, and rendered judgment accordingly, and the plaintiff appealed. The syllabus of the Supreme Court's opinion is as follows:

"One who indorses a sight draft with notice of its dishonor becomes liable to his indorsee on delivering the draft, and the statute of limitations then starts running."

M. F. Scott, as usual, conducted his own case.

**ANOTHER STRIKE CASE IS BEGUN**

Another "strike case" was begun before Judge De Bolt and a jury yesterday, the defendants being Fushino and Kawakami, who are charged with having unlawfully imprisoned three other Japanese, Katsujii Tamoda, Ioyoji Tsuzuki, and Hatsuhei Tamoda.

The offense was alleged to have been committed during the recent strike, the defendants being active as strike leaders.

A jury was quickly selected yesterday and the trial of the case immediately begun.

**CONDEMNATION MONEY PAID BY UNCLE SAM**

One thousand dollars has been paid into the office of the United States District Attorney by the United States, the money being for the payment of the judgment in the condemnation proceedings through which the government acquires ownership of the Keiki land at Waikiki. United States District Attorney Breckons received recently the approval of the Department of Justice of the papers he submitted in the condemnation matter.

900 enlisted men in the army who are stationed within the territorial limits of the United States are located in more than 150 posts, some of them in the centers of population and others on the frontier and in remote corners, with the men in charge ranging in numbers from a dozen caretakers for ungarriioned posts to a regiment or more in thickly populated sections. In the Philippines the men are much more scattered and in locations that are not so easily accessible as the United States.

"The lot of the soldier today," said a well known army officer who has risen from the ranks, "is far in advance of what it was when I was a private. Frontier posts are not so isolated, communications are easier, opportunities for personal advancement and improvement intellectually have increased and in many other ways army life is at a higher level and the soldier is in every way far in advance of the private soldier of the European armies."

**Around the Police Station**

William Naepihi got into a fracas with Mele Kapua and proceeded to commit assault and battery, according to the story told yesterday by the latter. At any rate, Mele swore to a complaint charging her friend with battery and yesterday afternoon William was taken into custody on a warrant.

While working on an automobile on the Hotel street stand, Vincent Freitas dropped to the ground, insensible. He was hurried to the Queen's Hospital in the police patrol. His illness, though violent for a time, is not thought to be serious.

Kawaa, according to the police, took another man's coat and shirt. As he failed to rectify his error, he landed in the police station last night with a charge of larceny in the second degree opposite his name on the blotter.

Henry Kamaha is alleged to have stolen a bicycle. Larceny in the second degree is the charge against him.
