**PUBLIC BACK OF COMMITTEE**

Promotionists Find People of the  
Territory Ready to Back  
Them Up.

Secretary Cooper's weekly letter to  
the members of the promotion com-  
mittee, presented yesterday, was:

"I may have mentioned it before,  
but there is no harm in remarking again  
that one of our greatest causes for con-  
gratulation is the interest which the  
public generally of the Territory is  
showing in the work of the Hawaii Pro-  
motion Committee, and the spirit of  
cooperation which is manifested in some  
form almost every day. In response to  
our circular letter and the newspaper  
notices asking business men to dis-  
tribute in their mainland correspondence  
our little information leaflets, we re-  
ceived many responses from all parts of  
the Territory from persons who ex-  
pressed a most cordial willingness to  
help in this way. I am encouraged to  
believe that we would have equally  
cordial support in suggesting an en-  
velope design of some kind, such as was  
recently discussed. By the next Ala-  
meda we should receive our first lot of  
1910 floral parade posters, together  
with a lot of postcards and stickers  
bearing the same design. The public  
will be asked to help us distribute the  
cards and stickers. These latter are  
about the size of the sambeam stamps,  
which have recently been distributed  
about the city, and are intended to be  
used in the same way—except that they  
will not cost the user anything.

**Good Promotion Methods.**

"Our newspapers all play a most im-  
portant part in publicity work, which,  
of course, we all fully recognize and  
appreciate. Aside from the space they  
give in their columns to promotion mat-  
ters, the papers themselves, by their  
generally up-to-date appearance, are a  
big advertisement to the Territory. The  
manager of one of the papers made a  
ten-strike recently in another direc-  
tion which has and will do a great deal  
of good for Hawaii. He took time to  
write a letter to one of the big news-  
paper feature syndicates of the main-  
land, congratulating them on the ex-  
cellence of their cartoon service, and  
especially commending the work of one  
of their leading cartoonists. The result  
of this was that the letter in question  
was reproduced in an attractive circular  
and distributed by the syndicate to  
thousands of newspapers all over the  
country, and the artist complimented,  
awakened to the fact that Hawaii is on  
the map and immediately began turn-  
ing out cartoons in which the Territory  
figures in a striking manner. Several  
of these have already appeared and  
have doubtless been published in many  
thousands of papers; and it is a safe  
bet that Hawaii has won permanent  
friends not only in the cartoonist, but  
also in the syndicate, and that we shall  
hear from both in the future.

**Public and Private Help.**

"We get very willingly a great deal  
of help from the territorial commis-  
sioner of public lands, the Hawaii ex-  
periment station, and the superintend-  
ent of public instruction, to whom in-  
quiries on special matters from a great  
many different sources are referred by  
us. At the suggestion of Mr. A. W.  
Van Valkenberg, I have also recently  
referred to him a number of letters  
from persons who wish to come to  
Hawaii and want work. Mr. Van Val-  
kenberg answered these in an exceed-  
ingly conservative manner, at the same  
time expressing his conviction that Ha-  
waii has a place for a few of the right  
kind of American farm hands, and that  
the conditions here are better for the  
out-of-doors worker than in most places  
on the mainland. \* \* \*

**Automobile and Hack Rates.**

"I would call your attention to the  
fact that an ordinance is about to be  
passed by the board of supervisors reg-  
ulating by law, rates which may be  
charged by automobiles for hire and  
revising the present hack rate law. In-  
asmuch as this is a matter which  
touches every tourist, and on which as  
much as anything else the reputation  
of Honolulu among the tourist class  
must rest, it would seem that this body  
should use all its influence in seeing  
that a reasonable schedule of rates is  
enacted. A full hearing should be in-  
sisted upon. This is a matter which  
all large cities give much attention to,  
for the protection of their citizens and  
visitors.

**Communications.**

"We have a marked copy of the  
Washington College Review, of Topeka,  
Kansas, announcing an address by the  
Rev. W. D. Westervelt, on Hawaii,  
which was given recently. This lec-  
ture was illustrated by a large num-  
ber of lantern slides, and made a great  
impression on a large audience. Mr.  
Westervelt has spoken at a number of  
large gatherings recently.

"We have a letter from Brig-Gen.  
Frank Taylor, U. S. A., retired, now  
of Seattle, asking for information con-  
cerning Honolulu, and stating that he  
and his wife will spend several months  
here this winter.

"R. C. Brown of Tacoma writes to  
say that he saw our exhibit at the  
A. Y. P. Exposition, and wants to  
make his home in Hawaii. He desires  
to know especially about the outlook  
for rubber, the cost of lands, govern-  
ment lands, etc.

"A prominent resident of San Di-  
ego, whom I had the pleasure of meet-  
ing at Seattle, writes:  
"Although we [himself and wife]  
have long wanted to visit the islands,  
yet the visit to your building at the  
A. Y. P., and meeting your people,  
crystallized my wish into a positive de-  
termination."  
"A great many responses are being  
received now from chambers of com-  
merce and other organizations and in-  
dividuals, acknowledging the receipt of  
copies of Secretary Wood's annual re-  
port. Some of the letters are very  
highly complimentary, and I feel that  
our organization is making friends all  
over the world, and that our activity  
and our methods are attracting wide-  
spread attention.  
"We have received a supply of guide  
books and pamphlets from the Royal

Packet Company, of the India Nether-  
lands (Batavia, Java), with a state-  
ment that they were sent by the ad-  
vice of 'Mr. Osgood of Boston.' They  
will prove interesting to tourists plan-  
ning a visit to that interesting coun-  
try.  
"American Consul Arnold, at Amoy,  
China, writes to acknowledge receipt  
of Mr. Wood's report, and takes occa-  
sion to suggest that we call attention  
of the U. S. Agricultural Experiment  
Station to the 'Amoy pumelo and the  
South China laichi,' both of which, he  
says, are extremely delicious fruits and  
should prove very desirable in Hawaii  
if adapted to conditions here."
