KAUAI AS SEEN BY ARTIST WIX

Striking Canvases Are Shown at the Exhibition at the Young Hotel.

Otto Wix, the artist, has returned from Kauai where he has been working for several months past, and he has brought with him the golden sunsets of the Garden Island, the purple mists, the varicolored seas, the mysterious mountains, the yellow sands. On the canvases which he painted on the island that in some respects is the most beautiful of the entire group, he has perpetuated the beauties that but comparatively few beauty-lovers of the world may see and that many who do not see find it difficult to believe really exist.

But to those who have lived in Hawaii long enough to know the infinite variety of the color schemes of the Islands, to become acquainted with their wonderful skies, to love their incredibly tinted waters, there is nothing bizarre in the paintings of Otto Wix, nothing too highly colored, nothing overdrawn. Mr. Wix has succeeded in reproducing on canvas the soft, delicately colored hazes of the Hawaiian mountains, the purple shadows of the canyons, the wild profusion of colors of the waters, the mysterious, elusive distances.

Yesterday at the Young Hotel, was opened an exhibition of the Kauai paintings of Mr. Wix, cards to the exhibition being sent out by Mrs. A. G. Hawes, who was hostess. Hundreds of the art lovers of Honolulu crowded the parlors to see Mr. Wix's work and all of them went away enthusiastic over what they had seen.

Mr. Wix has been spending several months on Kauai, much of the time at the home of Francis Gay, and he has been prolific in his production. He has about fifty-one fine water colors on exhibition, and will continue to show them as long as he remains in Honolulu. Most of them are listed for sale, but there are several which Mr. Wix refuses to part with—and he cannot be blamed. Nobody would want to part with them.

Out of the many pictures lining the walls of the Young Hotel parlors, it is difficult for one who had but an hour to spend looking at them to pick out the best for special mention. Even Mr. Wix himself professes inability to say what is best. "They are all so different," he says, "and each one tells its own story."

But there are some that stand out so prominently that even the casual looker-on cannot help but be struck by their strange beauty and peculiar characteristics.

Hawaiian Colors.

It is a common saying in Hawaii that the colors are so vivid here that the artist cannot use too bright colors on his palette or make his canvases too lurid. The saying may be common, but it is not true, for all that. The colors of Hawaii are not vivid or lurid. They are bright, as a general thing, brighter than anywhere else in America, perhaps, except on the great deserts which are a yellow glare of sunlight, or in the great canyons where the painted rocks are tinted with indescribable colors. But the brightness of the Hawaiian land or water scene is softened and mellowed by a delicate, in some cases almost imperceptible, pearl-colored haze which, except in close foregrounds, takes away all harshness of outlines and all glaring contrasts of color.

This Hawaiian peculiarity Mr. Wix has caught and transferred to his canvases. There is not a gloomy picture among all those that he is exhibiting, but neither is there one that rises up and slaps one in the face. There is a general atmosphere of brightness, of sunshine, of clear skies, glittering waters, richly tinted cliffs, opulent distances. One feels the out-of-doors, hears the droning of the breakers, the murmur of the Trades, smells the salt tang of the sea.

Waimea Canyon.

One of the larger canvases and one that strikes the eye on entering the room is "The Waimea Canyon." In this, back of a tumbled foreground sharply defined in the sunlight, are hazy distances, mountains mellowed by that same indescribable haze that few can put into words; purple shadows that contain no suggestion of gloom. The scene is not excessively wild, yet it gives a sense of openness, freedom, the large feeling that one gets only when facing boundless space.

Of somewhat the same type, yet differing greatly in detail and manner of handling, are two pictures of the Grand Canyon of Okekele. Both of these, large canvases, give an excellent impression of height and depth. One, called "The Grand Canyon of Okekele," is slightly veiled with that soft, pearly haze that Wix has so well succeeding in reproducing. In the foreground on both sides of the steep canyon walls are bright green of vivid vegetation, while far beyond in the mysterious distance the clouds come down to obscure the summits of the canyon walls and mingle with the mists that swirl at the upper end of the great gulch.

The companion picture, called "The Gate to the Paradise, Okekele," gives perhaps a greater idea of distance, with brighter colors in the foreground, and a more solemn depth. There are more purples and violets in the shadows, a little more of the majestic, perhaps a little less tenderness.

The Mana Coast.

"Early Morning on the Coast of Mana" can not but attract attention, both from the faithfulness of rendering and the sympathetic touch that tells that the artist painted something that he loved.

From the foot of purple cliffs grey mists rise from the smoking waters and are dissipated by the first strong rays of the morning light, while in the sky just turning bright with the promise of the coming sun float delicate clouds touched with the delicate shades of the new morning. A dash of more vivid color is added by the reddish yellow of the sands in the foreground.

Of a bolder, more imposing sort is the "Coast of Haena," wherein sav-

age, rugged rocks rise from a racing sea and become massive cliffs, their somber ruggedness set off by the brighter colors of green vegetation in the foreground.

Wix's Versatility.

The versatility of the artist is attested by his "Sunset, Hanalei," which is very different from anything else among the pictures exhibited. It is a sunset with the sun hidden yet half revealed through red-gold clouds, the golden rays melting imperceptibly into a brilliant purple and violet haze that softens and half obscures the outline of the mountain beyond. The peculiar tint of this sunset haze is reflected on the quiet surface of the waters of the bay. In the distance the masts and spars of two small vessels are silhouetted against the eastern sky. The picture, one of the smaller canvases, is probably the most daring of those exhibited, and attracted much attention.

There are so many others, all of them good, that any attempt even to give an idea of them, is futile. And, anyway, there is little use in attempting to describe the work of an artist. Description of that means little, for pictures are to be seen, not talked or written about.
