POLICE BECOME APOLOGETIC NOW

Sheriff Jarrett and Officer Keawe Appease an Angry Chinaman.

The usual amount of trouble came to the attention of Judge Andrade yesterday in police court to be adjusted. The calendar was smaller than usual with but four names on it and no drunks but the complaints against offenders were diversified.

The charge of assault and battery brought against Police Officer David Keawe, by L. Ah Leong, was not pressed as the police department, represented by the accused officer and Sheriff Jarrett, apologized to the Chinaman and soothed his injured feelings.

They had previously arrested Ah Leong for violating the Sunday law, to which charge he pleaded guilty, and then claimed that he had been assaulted by Keawe.

When arrested he had wanted to go after his hat and coat and his request was refused. Taking him to the police station from his store on King street another man passing objected to the way in which Keawe was handling his prisoner and Ah Leong got an extra little push which tripped him up and he broke his glasses. However, the apology appeased him.

Santiago Berez met with the usual fate of a peacemaker and together with the man whom he attempted to convert to the principal that a soft answer turns away wrath, was yesterday fined \$3 in the police court.

The other man in the case was Antonio Marques, who, in the Merchants Exchange Saloon, had seen fit to end an altercation with a companion by trying to make him the subject for a coroner's jury. Berez, seeing an opportunity to do a Christian act and fulfil the spirit of the Christmas holidays which was moving him, added himself to the fray with the expressed purpose of mitigating its ensuing horrors and accidentally stuck his thumb in Marques' mouth. Marques bit it.

Now, even the most charitable inclined are liable to experience a revulsion of feelings when their neighbor happens to nearly sever the end of one of their digits and with his free hand, Berez started in his peacemaking by attempting to remove Marques from this struggling world. A policeman happening to occur at this time took them both in tow and more effectually allayed the row.

Another affray not so rich in detail, was also aired in court and ended with a handshaking contest and a laugh or two. This was the case against Eric Smith, carpenter on board the bark Nuuanu who threatened a darky stevedore with a revolver. The colored gentleman, who answers to the name of Sam Campbell, began to pick a quarrel with the mate of the vessel, who is an elderly man, and Smith seeing that there would be trouble, jumped between them and scared Campbell off.

Judge Andrade advised the men to get out behind the scenes and kiss and make up which they did and the nigger was so tickled that he laughed all the way down the aisle and had to be plugged. The case has been continued to January 15, by which time the bark will be on the high seas.

Morning prayer with choral Celebration of the Holy Communion at 10:30 o'clock.


The church authorities would be very glad to receive any flowers before 2:30 o'clock today, with which to assist in decorating the church for Christmas day.
