It is not surprising that the occupants of Thurston's Fool's Paradise strive to make up for their inexperience as new-comers by inventing a few deliberate falsehoods concerning the editor of the Bulletin.—Bulletin.

Honolulu plays no favorites. It will accept four Honoluluans as a bonus for the two hundred and twenty-seven thousand-ton freight contract, as well as four Wilhelmians. Passenger ships are what Honolulu must have with its freights.—Bulletin.

That freight-carrying contract ought to be worth about three Wilhelmians to the city of Honolulu, at the very least.—Bulletin.

Meanwhile if the promotion committee for the same business men of these Islands feel that three plague cases or a dozen cases call for exaggerated advertising of garbled facts, there is no way in which they can do the city and Territory more injury without accomplishing the slightest reciprocal good for the improved sanitation of the plantations or island towns, than by blazing the way with scurrilous talk and headlines.—Bulletin.

JURY INDICTS MAX SCHLEMMER
Charges of Importing Contract Laborers and of Poaching on Bird Reservation.

Three indictments were brought in yesterday against Max Schlemmer, for use "king of Laysan," by the federal grand jury, and he is now under arrest on a bench warrant. Two of the indictments charge him with having brought aliens unlawfully into the United States and the third charges that he is guilty of having poached on the federal bird reservation. Schlemmer was released on \$1000 bond. The principal witnesses against him at the trial will probably be the twenty-three Japanese who were captured by the revenue cutter Thetis, and who, after having served terms of twenty-four hours each in jail, are now held as witnesses.

Schlemmer is not the only victim of the grand jury's activities. Li Ah Leong, the prominent Chinese merchant of Honolulu, is indicted for bigamy, it being charged that he had a wife in China as well as one in Honolulu. Ah Leong is a familiar figure in the courts, but this is the first time he has ever been in difficulty that promises to be as serious as that of the bigamy charge.

Goa Pang, a Chinese recently captured by the federal officers with opium in his possession, was indicted on the charge of receiving and concealing smoking opium.

Chang Chen is indicted on a charge similar to that under which Goa Pang rests. Y. Ni-hida is charged by the grand jury with making donations.

White and Wilson, the two chauffeurs arrested last week on the charge of bootlegging, were up before Commissioner Judd yesterday afternoon. Wilson, who was represented by Attorney Strauss, waived examination and was released on his own recognizance. White was bound over to the April term of the grand jury, his bond being placed at \$1000. The bond was furnished and he was released. T. M. Harrison is going to defend him.


