WATERFRONT NEWS

Steamers Depart.
 Two big steamships left port yesterday morning for opposite sides of the Pacific. The Japanese liner Tenyo Maru left for San Francisco at nine-thirty, and the transport Sheridan steamed out for the tight little island of Guam and the port of Manila. The Tenyo's departure was unusually animated, as she is carrying the largest list of passengers ever brought across the Pacific in a passenger liner other than the tourist steamer Cleveland. The Sheridan left at noon. From this port she took a big consignment of sisal bolls, consigned to the bureau of forestry of Manila, to be experimented with in the Philippines. They are of the variety which is producing the best sisal twine.

Has Many Passengers.
 Captain Johnson of the Matson steamship Wilhelmina has wireless to Castle & Cooke, agents, that he is bringing seventy-six passengers, fifty-eight sacks of mail, 2400 tons of cargo for Honolulu, 725 tons for Hilo. The vessel was 1248 miles out from San Francisco on Friday night. Everybody aboard is well.

New York leads in entries and Antwerp is first in clearances. The tonnage of Montevideo as the first South American port with entries and clearances larger than Buenos Ayres is rather surprising, and the fact that Antwerp leads London is probably due to a difference in computing the tonnage.

Shipping Notes.
 The Likelike arrived yesterday morning from Hawaii with 6528 sacks of sugar and 53 head of cattle.
 The Pacific Mail liner Mongolia arrived at San Francisco yesterday, having left this port on May 8.
 The transport Dix arrived at Seattle yesterday from Honolulu. The transport will undergo an extensive overhauling.

When the Wilhelmina departs for San Francisco May 25 she will have a full list of passengers and a big general cargo of island products.

The Matson freighter Nevada is due this morning from San Francisco. This will be her first arrival under the Matson flag since her transfer from the American-Hawaiian line.

The following vessels were passed by the steamer Mauna Kea on her homeward voyage from Hilo: The Cascade at Papaikou, Kauai at Hakalan, Helene at Kohohale, Kaulani at Panahou and the Mani at Honokaa.

The Pacific Mail liner Asia is the latest vessel of the P. M. fleet to be equipped with wireless. A message was received Friday night from the steamer, giving the time of her arrival here as Tuesday morning next. Only one liner yet remains to be equipped with wireless.

Hilo shipping at the time of departure of the Mauna Kea included the American-Hawaiian freighter Arizona, which arrived there Friday morning; the Matson Navigation steamer Enterprise was expected to sail for San Francisco on next Tuesday. The schooner Balboa is taking on a shipment of railway ties. This vessel was scheduled to sail on Friday or today. The schooner S. T. Alexander is discharging railway ties, and the ship Edward Sewall is expected to finish loading sugar by the coming week.
