### NEW INVENTION IN ENGLAND PREVENTS AIRSHIP ACCIDENTS

LONDON.—The question of insuring the automatic stability of the heavier than air machines has been under consideration for some time. Sir Hiram Maxim having been among those who have endeavored to evolve a design that would successfully accomplish this idea. It appears that Lieut. G. W. Dumeaneau has invented a contrivance whereby this can be accomplished. The invention was tested recently at the Aero Club flying ground at Shepp, when Lieutenant Dumeaneau rose to a height of some sixty feet and at once let go of the steering levers, etc. Instead of becoming unmanageable, the aeroplane continued its flight with the greatest steadiness. After having flown two and a half miles in this manner, Lieutenant Dumeaneau came to earth.

The aeroplane employed is a biplane, but without the ordinary tail or rudders. The only steering planes attached to the machine consist of two small flaps at the rear extremity of the upper plane. The direction of the aeroplane is altered by means of these two flaps. The weight of the flying machine is 1700 pounds, and it is driven by a fifty horsepower British Green motor and has a carrying surface of 500 square feet. Further experiments must doubtless be carried out before the invention can be pronounced thoroughly satisfactory. Grahame White, who had arranged to make some flights from Ranelagh, whither he had flown from Brooklands a few days ago, was prevented from doing so during the early part of the day owing to the wind. Towards evening, however, the wind had sufficiently dropped to enable a flight to be attempted. Rising to a height of about six hundred feet, Mr. White flew over the houses to Putney and back, thus offering a good opportunity for the crowds of people in the streets and elsewhere to see the famous flying man piloting his biplane.


