Unterrified Name Their Convention Delegates in Various Island Precincts.
Democrats all over the city and island will meet tonight to nominate candidates for the territorial and county conventions.
There will be very little opposition in any of the precincts, and tickets already in the field will go through without contests, save in isolated instances.
It is understood that the nominees are generally pledged to support the present Democratic candidates in office, who include Mayor Fern, Sheriff Jarrett, Deputy Sheriff Rose, Treasurer Trent, and suggested candidates for the legislature and various municipal offices, will be given full support. The Democratic political machine is working smoothly and very little friction is heard of. Timekeeper Lowe of the road department has voiced opposition against the mayor's secretary, B. Rivenburgh, and in the last day or two the rumor has spread that Lowe is so buffed that he has changed his political faith from Democracy to Republicanism. His friends, however, deny this.

COUNTIES DESIRE MORE REVENUE
May Appeal to Legislature to Give Counties Assessing and Taxing Powers.
(Mail Special to The Advertiser.)
HILO, August 22.—One matter that will probably be drawn to the attention of voters on this island during the present campaign, is the question of taxation, and it is very likely there will be an act introduced, at the next session of the legislature, to again amend the county act.
The county of Hawaii, owing to its size, has more jails and schoolhouses to keep in repair than falls, proportionately, to any other county and without the corresponding increase in income. There are also more jailers, police and district magistrates to pay. The wet weather here compels more repairs to buildings as well as more repairs to roads, and the trouble is how to get the best results with the money available.
There is a pretty general opinion that the county should have its own assessor, especially as there is a large quantity of idle land on Hawaii that is assessed as a nonproducer. If its taxation value were put at its market value for agriculture or building lots, then there would be an increase in revenue, the land might be put on the market and become still more valuable as a revenue producer when built upon or utilized as farm or pasture land.
Another point, and the one on which there seems to be a chance of a joint Maui and Hawaii fight is that the taxes on corporations doing business on these islands be turned over as county revenue and not to the Territory in Honolulu.
It is claimed that the land on the Big Island and the business done by plantations from the land enable their success and their profits, and that the taxes should be used where the soil is taxed by cultivation for production and profit of the owners or lessees. In short, the claim is that the tax money is earned here and should be spent here.
The subject is one that is likely to cause considerable debate in the legislature, if not on the stump, and its advocacy may be plainly set forth in one or more of the party platforms.

ASKED SHERIFF TO EAT POISON
An Aged Chinaman Requests Jarrett to Test Some Doubtful Pork.
Sheriff Jarrett is the mark of a Chinese for consignment to the happy hunting grounds.
Yesterday afternoon the sheriff was invited to partake of some greasy-looking fried pork, handed to him by an old Chinaman with the request that he eat it to see whether it contained poison. The Chinaman made his request in all seriousness.
Sheriff Jarrett is accustomed to hearing odd requests and suggestions, but the one made to him by Lum Seong was by all odds, the queerest. The Chinaman approached the sheriff and deputy sheriff while they were standing on the steps of the station and handed the package over to "Big Bill." "I like you eat 'em," said he. "Me all same think no good." The sheriff took the package and smiled. His smile is much like "Li Artha's" but not so golden.
"You want to put the sheriff out of commission," inquired Deputy Sheriff Rose.
"I think so, yes," was the Chinaman's startling answer.
When the package was opened it was found to contain pieces of fried pork for which the aged possessor said he had paid five cents. The sheriff at this stage found it necessary to call in the services of an interpreter to get the straight of the request. Through the interpreter the old Chinaman made known that he had been in the habit of purchasing fried pork at a Chinese store on Maunakea street. A few days ago after eating pork from this place his hands and feet tingled and he became hot and cold and had pains in his stomach, accompanied by violent vomiting. Some children had similar symptoms immediately after eating. He had bought more pork from the same place and the same peculiar stomach gripings followed. The Chinaman went a little further in his explanations and advanced the theory that the proprietor of the store kept poison under his counter and whenever the aged man came to buy, poison was put on the pork.
He expressed the belief that the package of pork in his hand was poisoned and he therefore, desired the sheriff to eat and make a test.
"Well, I've heard of trying things out on a dog, but this trying it out on the sheriff is the newest thing on the market," commented the sheriff as he sent the deputy sheriff with the package to Territorial Chemist Blanchard to test the pork slices.
