The Monowai.

The R. M. S. Monowai, Captain Carey, arrived this morning from Australia. The pilot from the tug boat communicated the news to her in regard to the alleged epidemic in Honolulu and the steamer immediately laid aloof awaiting orders from the agents. Under present considerations the captain who carries over 200 souls in his ship decided not to take any chances, and he refused passengers, freight and mail. Although the business community feels injured by the decision of the captain, it is generally held that he absolutely watched the interest of his passengers. The Monowai went as far as Diamond Head and then she cleared out like a bird for San Francisco.

The mail had been fumigated and the agent of the Post Office dressed himself with a black sash and a yellow flowers in his hat. Even these emblems of cholera could not induce Captain Carey to take the mail and the black sash and yellow flowers will be devoted for future occasions.

The agents of the steamer did exactly what could be done under the circumstances. They left the decision of taking or not taking to the master of the vessel to whom they presented a straight statement of the official "truth." The Monowai has left.
