TOPICS OF THE DAY.

Under a portrait of Princess Kaiulani, by a strange irony of fate, the Hawaiian prints these words: "The people are the only rulers to-day."

We haven't touched the Hawaiian this month yet. 'Tis truly horrible, but yet it's a fact. It might be imagined—and is no doubt—that we couldn't get enough brains to attend to it before to-day. But—as the little girls say—truly, "we haven't time enough to attend to his immoralities" and other portions of news—it is time enough for us when we get our news out. It may be right to give him—as he has given his paper—"the curse of Cromwell"—but that is for him to say.

An old sermon of S. C. Damon's has been unearthed by the Hawaiian. In it he says, referring to the foreign population: "The latter have enjoyed privileges and immunities under the native government such as foreigners in other lands never dreamt of." We knew him. If he could only have lived to these days he wouldn't have said so.
