LATE FOREIGN NEWS.

(By the S. S. Austalia.)

H. B. M.'s ship Hyacinth is at San Francisco.

No referee has yet been selected for the Corbett-Fitzsimmons fight.

The British Consul at San Francisco has been raised to the rank of Consul-General.

China has withdrawn its consent to the commission to investigate the missionary riots at Cheng Tu.

Professor Pasteur, the discoverer of inoculation as a cure for rabies, is suffering from paralysis of his legs.

General Nelson A. Miles will succeed Lieutenant-General Schofield as Commander-in-Chief of the U. S. Army.

The anti gambling law in Montana has been declared unconstitutional, and all the old gambling halls will be re-opened.

President Cleveland has extended the civil service rules to all consular offices whose compensation ranges from \$1,000 to \$2,500 a year.

The Duke of Marlborough has announced his engagement to Miss Consuelo Vanderbilt, a daughter of the multi-millionaire W. K. Vanderbilt.

It is stated that Charles D. Rose of the Royal Yacht Squadron has sent a challenge to the cup committee of the New York Yacht Club for the American's Cup.

The Hawaiian Steamer Kahului has been chartered by the Hawaiian Commercial Company, to take a cargo of general merchandise, to the port of Kahului on Maui.

Professor James C. Kennedy, principal of the San Francisco Normal School, died on the 23d inst, while attending readings in the auditorium of the Girls High School.

All political prisoners in Italy were pardoned by King Humbert in honor of the commemoration of the 25th anniversary of the Italian army's entrance into Rome.

Many accomplices of the French spies arrested recently at Cologne, Germany, have been captured. Many foreigners have been expelled from Berlin, including eleven Frenchmen.

The congregation of the First Presbyterian Church of Washington of which President and Mrs. Cleveland are members, have extended a call to Rev. De Witt Talmage to become associate pastor.

The hunting season in Europe has opened well as far as accidents are concerned. Prince Ladislas of Austria, Prince Ernest R. ban and Lord Beaumont have all fallen as victims to the deadly shot-gun which is never "loaded."

Colonel North, "the Nitrate King," has purchased a mile of the sea front of Ostend from the King of Belgium. The price paid was \$1,500,000. The colonel intends to found an international sporting club on the land.

At the international athletic contest which took place between the New York Athletic Club and the London Athletic Club on Manhattan Field, the American beat the English at every event and broke all previous records.

General Enrique Collazo has succeeded in leaving Florida with a filibustering expedition for Cuba. A 700 tons steamer was chartered and on her was stowed away 2,500 rifles, 900,000 rounds of ammunition, 800 machetes and 400 pounds of dynamite.

King Alexander of Servia is bride-hunting at present. The Hesse family seem unwilling to give him one of their numerous princesses and he will probably have to be satisfied with a daughter of Princess Dolgobrouki, themorganatic wife of the late Emperor of Russia.

The Spanish gunboats Sanchez and Bacastegi collided on the 18th ult. with a merchant steamer in the canal at the entrance to the harbor of Havana. The steamer sank immediately. Rear-Admiral Perejo, four officers and thirty seamen were thrown overboard from the gunboats and drowned.

The celebrated Durrant case in San Francisco is still dragging on in the courts. The prosecution expects to close the case of the people against the alleged murderer very shortly and the public is awaiting the line of the defense with great interest. Betting on the result of the trial is very heavy among the sports. The odds are in favor of the acquittal of the defendant.
