Our Own Native Band.

It is pleasing to note the following, among many other, kindly notices of the recent performances of the Royal Hawaiian Band at the Orpheum, San Francisco.

The S. F. Bulletin says: "The Hawaiian National Band and Glee Club were the great features at the Orpheum Music Hall, and the immense audience seemed unwilling to allow them to leave the stage. Libornio, the leader, is the right man in the right place, and has his musicians completely under control. The glee singing is a most interesting part of these islanders' performance. They have excellent voices and their ensembles are most agreeable. The miscellaneous audience seemed captivated with their vocalism. Music bath charms for the average San Franciscan, and Manager Walter will find he has made a happy hit in the engagement of these Hawaiians."

The Daily Report says: "The Royal Hawaiian Band, under the leadership of Prof. J. S. Libornio, was the piece de resistance at the Orpheum last night. Although the patrons of this house are ardent lovers of the vaudeville, they seemed willing last night to give all their attention to the band. Its first appearance, however, was immediately after the disappearance of Annie Suits, "America's favorite comedienne," and the audience may have been anxious to drown remembrance of her in a flood of melody. At any rate the people were carried away with enthusiasm after the splendid rendition from "William Tell" and Prof. Libornio's saxophone solo, "The Battle Cry of Freedom." The applause won a few short musical gems, such as Sousa loves to entertain an appreciative audience with. The Hawaiian Glee Club followed a little later, and more enthusiasm was aroused. The band will no doubt prove a strong drawing card throughout the week."

The Chronicle says: "The Hawaiian Band made a decided success last night at the Orpheum. They were encored so often that it looked as if they would keep the stage all the evening. They play excellently and they sing as well."

The Evening Post says: "At the Orpheum last night the Royal Hawaiian Band and the Glee Club was, of course, the feature of the occasion being excellent throughout and winning any amount of thoroughly well deserved applause. They present many interesting instrumental numbers, while the vocal performances of the Glee Club are almost attractive. In the musicians from the isles of the sea Manager Walter certainly has an acquisition."

Channel Steamers

Two new vessels are being built for the Calais and Dover mail service, built in accordance with the arrangements between the French and English railway companies, these are to be constructed in France, the order having gone to the Chantiers De La Loire, the owners of the company being the Northern Railway of France. These vessels are to steam 21 knots, so as to cross the silver streak within the hour, and the power is to be 700 horsepower. The boats are to have side paddles. As these are the first paddle steamers of high speed constructed by French builders for the channel, it will be interesting to watch their performances. Only the other day, a London correspondent mentioned that a new Dieppe and Newhaven twin screw steamer was to be built in France. The Cockerill boats for the Belgian Government have done well on the Dover and Ostend passage; and now the third great route—that between Calais and Dover—is to have foreign steamers, and the remarkable thing is that on all three English mails are carried.
