SLANDERING HAWAII.

The wild and reckless stories concerning physical defects among school children to which the irresponsible Advertiser has given currency were properly condemned by the board of health yesterday.

It is abroad, however, and such exaggerated and untruthful stories do the greatest injury, as the anti-anthropologist newspapers will take it up as demonstrating that this is a diseaseridden and disease-breeding country.

DUTY OF REPUBLICANS.

While the selection of a man for delegate to congress is most important, of even greater importance at this time is the selection of men for members of the First Legislature of Hawaii.

Being a new territory of the American Union, there are many and onerous duties devolving upon the members of the first territorial legislature. Many of the present laws need revision to conform to the new conditions.

With the exception of the two districts on the island of Oahu the independents have made their nominations for the legislature. While they are in the main good men, they are not men of sufficient experience in public affairs to fit them for the very important duties which will fall upon the members of the first territorial legislature of Hawaii.

ONLY ENGLISH LANGUAGE WILL BE ALLOWED.

The sophistry of the independent home rule party in their conception of what is meant by that section of the Organic Act which says: "All legislative proceedings shall be conducted in the English language," would be amusing were it not so serious.

The meaning of the word "proceeding" as given by the authorities on the English language is: "Action contemplated as in process or with reference to its successive steps; process of movement from one thing to another; transaction; measure; step."

Again, let us take the word "conducted" and find out its meaning. Used in the sense it is used here its meaning is given as "to carry on."

The importance of the first legislature of the territory of Hawaii must lead the very best men in the community to accept the republican nominations for the legislature. The party must nominate the very best men in the territory, and no man thus honored can afford to shirk the responsibility entrusted to him.

Why is it necessary to have a session of all the governor's appointees, except the executive council, and conduct regular legislative proceedings at such a session over a subject that has no bearing whatever upon any other department than the one in which it originated? Will the Tiger answer that question?

This is the proper method and The Republican commends Mr. Brown for his action.


