Some fine specimens of pre-historic shells were found in several blocks of coral taken from the excavation at the corner of Fort and King streets yesterday.

Hoffschlaeger & Co. has filed a bond in the sum of \$500 with Robert Lange and W. Lanz as sureties in an injunction case against F. Akin, restraining him from interfering with certain property included in his store at Lahaina.

By getting out of the harbor before January 1 the schooner Rosemond and bark Olympic will save the owners of their cargoes almost \$3,000. This is because their cargoes, if in the territory on the first day of January, would be liable to the tax of one per cent levied on that day.

CHINESE RELIEF FUNDS NOT TO BE DIVERTED

Society Last Night Refused to Use Cash on Hands for Citizenship Fight—Rumors of Disapproval.

Funds belonging to the Chinese Relief Society which have lain in deposit in Bishop's Bank for several years, will in all probability remain in the custody of that society, and be used to defray expenses of maintaining the Chinese Hospital.

Such was the sense of the meeting held last evening in the hall of the Chinese Protective Union on King street, which was well filled with prominent citizens of the city. The mooted question as to what would be done with the funds, which now reach close to \$9,000, has been agitating Oriental circles for some time.

Those at the head of the Chinese Relief Society maintain that the money was originally raised for charitable purposes and this fact should not be lost sight of, and the wishes of the donors should be respected. However there were rumors of disapproval from members of the Chinese United Society and they stoutly insisted that the expenses of a special representative in Washington to fight their citizenship case should come out of this fund. In outline the question to vote the relief society had the majority with them and carried the day.

Water Notice.


