Mrs. Joe Emmet's Fine Dogs.

Of course you remember Mr. Emmet's great St. Bernard, Hector. He is a fine dog, but Mrs. Emmet's pets surpass the record in that line. When the family were last in England they bought from Mrs. Mary Ann Trougher, of Bury, a small Yorkshire terrier, which now weighs but five pounds, and is small enough to be carried about in a glass case no larger than a cigar box. This dog, called Champion Conqueror, has half eight inches long, softer than a camel's hair brush, which is usually parted on the forehead and tied back behind his ear with a ribbon in order to enable him to see. The hair on the body is of a genuine silver and bluish tint, and trails the ground. His ears are of a dark tau color, his forehead a light blonde, with shades of gold, as are also his legs; the muzzle and beard of a rich tan, while the hair around his nose and hips are black, and his eyes are a very dark hazel. This dog carried off fifty-eight first prizes and three champion prizes, such as gold and silver cups, medals and money, and was finally entered for the challenge prize, the highest of all, which he easily won.

Then Mr. Emmet purchased the dog for his wife, paying \$1,250 for him. Mrs. Emmet has another pet dog, no larger than a kitten, which cost \$300 on the West India docks in London. This one is a Japanese spaniel pug called Ching Ching. He weighs six pounds and is carried about in a small leather satchel with a wire front to it. It is said that in Japan these dogs are only owned by royalty, but Ching Ching was stolen by a sailor and carried to England. He is a beautiful little animal and is always very playful.

The Boston Science of Mind-Cure.

Supplies for Railroads in India.

What class of railway sleepers are used in India and South America? Are any metal sleepers used in these countries? asks a writer of The London Mechanical World, and they answer: In India, where wood is expensive and for other reasons, rectangular blocks of cast iron (hollow) chairs with tie rods. The chairs, etc., are, or were a few years ago, largely exported from Glasgow to India, and are suitable for light traffic over sandy soil on narrow gauges, more especially such as the Punjab, Scinde, or other large railways which have three feet three inches gauge, the Indian government having adopted it in 1873, after having for twenty-two years had experience with a five-foot six-inch gauge. Similar cast-iron chairs are regularly exported to South America, viz., from Liverpool to Buenos Ayres, etc.

The Clever Duchess of Edinburgh.

"The duchess of Edinburgh is said to be more than ordinarily clever and cultivated," writes Adam Badeau in his papers on aristocracy in England. "From those admitted to her intimate society I have heard that she is better informed in politics than many women in Europe in any sphere.
