The Side of the Strongest Battalions.
Nowhere in history is the profane idea that in a fair field fight, Providence is on the side of the strongest battalions, more uniformly sustained than in our civil war. It presents no example of the triumph of 15,000 or even 30,000 men against 25,000. It affords some such instances where the stronger force was surprised by rapid and unexpected movements, and still others where it was directed with a want of skill against chosen positions strengthened by the art of defense; but nowhere else. The weaker force is uniformly defeated or compelled to retire.—Gen. Buell in The Century.

John Jacob Astor and Stephen Girard.
It has often been said that John Jacob Astor was, sixty years ago, the only citizen of America worth \$1,000,000. He may have been the only New Yorker then possessed of such a fortune, but the wealth of Stephen Girard, of Philadelphia, would at that time have reached at least \$6,000,000. He died in 1831, leaving an estate valued at \$9,000,000, and Astor in 1848, leaving an estate of \$30,000,000, much of it having been accumulated within fifteen or twenty years.—Exchange.

Deposition of Artificial Iron Ore.
A curious phenomenon has just been brought to light by the removal of a lightning-rod. To the end of the rod, which had been imbedded in ferruginous earth for about fifteen years, was found attached a lump of iron ore, weighing ninety-six pounds, supposed to have been aggregated by the action of electricity from the surrounding earth.—Arkansas Traveler.
