

"DEER-STALKING."

SOME ARGUMENTS URGED IN FAVOR OF THE KINGLY SPORT.

What It Costs to Raise a Stag and "Bag the Game"—The Land Devoted to Deer-Raising—The Testimony.

(Chicago Times.)

Two of the leading English magazines contain in their issues for the present month articles on "Deer-Stalking." It appears that this kingly sport is as attractive as ever, though kings and their favorites are not now the only persons who engage in it. Fortune, not rank enables one to hunt deer in the forests of Great Britain at the present day. Last year, it is said, there were more bowmen and hunters than there were deer in the highlands of Scotland to engage in stag-hunting. Several noblemen have been obliged to rent out their deer forests in order to obtain money to keep up their establishments. Horace Greeley once informed a subscriber who asked him what he considered the best building material that he had never found anything that was as good as gold. Gold, and a large supply of it, is essential to the deer hunter.

DEER VERSUS SHEEP. The amount of land in Scotland devoted to deer-raising is estimated at about 2,000,000 acres. On this land about 4,000 stags and an equal number of hinds are shot each year. The entire number of the deer family on the 2,000,000 acres of game preserve is estimated at 250,000. The rent paid down for the deer forest this year amounts to \$1,160,000. Much has been said not only in this country but in Great Britain on the enormity of devoting all this land to the raising of deer, when it might be profitably employed for the production of sheep and cattle. The commissioners appointed to examine into the condition of the crofters gave great attention to this matter. There seemed to be abundant evidence that it was barely possible for one black-faced sheep to gain a living during the grazing season on six acres of this barren land, while there are large tracts on which twenty sheep would find it difficult to make a living on 100 acres.

The most favorable estimate was that all the deer forests in Scotland, if utilized to the utmost, might put on the market 400,000 sheep and lambs annually. It was admitted by all that the quality of the mutton would be very poor and most witnesses thought it would be necessary to carry up food to support the sheep during the winter. It was in evidence that the proprietors of the deer forests kept the sheep in such a condition that they were likely to overrun the country if sheep were kept instead of deer. The deer are able to reach the branches of the stunted trees and to eat foliage on them when the grass is short or altogether wanting. They can also go long distances in search of food. In the winter they crop the boughs of evergreens, and dig through the snow with their feet, eat the moss and dried grass.

IN FAVOR OF THE HUNTERS. The inhabitants of the highlands, almost without exception, gave testimony in favor of devoting the forests to breeding and raising deer. The gillies and their kinsmen were all in favor of their presence, and thought they were the benefactors of the country. Even the solemn parsons were favorable to keeping up the ancient sport of deer-stalking. They stated that not only themselves but many of their parishioners were under great obligations to the deer-hunters. The advocates of the abolition of the deer forests were chiefly professional philanthropists and demagogues who lived in large towns remote from the highland. A witness on being asked how it was that at one time in the highlands, according to a favorite post, "every rood of land maintained its man," replied that the people at that happy period supported themselves principally by making raids into the fertile country of the lowlanders and carrying off their stock and grain. Deer were as plenty in the forests then as now, and a much smaller number of sheep was kept.

Apparently, deer-stalking, which was one of the first sports introduced into Great Britain, will be among the last to be abolished. The land rent for more than a deer preserve than as a sheep pasture. The rent of deer forests is constantly advancing, while that of grazing and farming land is declining. American competition does not interfere with deer-raising as it does with grain-raising and stock-raising. The number of very wealthy people who have an ambition to lease their deer preserves increases with each generation, while the opposition to them appears to be dying out.

Malaria Among Dogs. [New York Sun.] "I never saw so many dogs down with malaria as at this moment," said Dr. R. G. Dorey. "This disease is always more or less prevalent among them, but at present it has become epidemic. How does it affect them? Oh, much the same as it affects a human being. They in no about for a day or two and then begin to sicken. After the shivering fit has passed they get into a high fever, and when that is gone they are very weak and sick. The attacks are intermittent, and if not carefully and skillfully attended to the dog will die. I treat them chiefly with quinine, which I give shortly before the fit is due. For a large dog I would give from six to eight grains. In instances where the disease was violent and stubborn I have even resorted to arsenic. For a small delicate dog I would prescribe not more than a third of that quantity.

The Cold Water Bath. [Chicago Herald.] Cold water bathing may prove beneficial or injurious. The radiant test of benefit is the glow of free surface circulation, or at least the absence of any decided chill after immersion. Those who take it should begin in summer, not winter, and so become gradually accustomed to its lowest temperature. No one should linger over it; three or four minutes is ample. After immersion the body should be quickly and well dried and rubbed before dressing. Light gymnastic or dumb-bell or club exercise may occupy the next few minutes, the clothes being partly on if the weather is cold, and breakfast or a cup of warm tea or coffee, should shortly follow, to prevent chilling.


