

HER FIRST BATTLE.

A VICTORY FOR THE CONFEDERATE STEAMER ALABAMA.

An Account of the Sinking of the U. S. Gunboat Hatteras - Crew Saved by the Alabama - Victory in Twenty Minutes.

On the afternoon of Jan. 11, 1862, the U. S. gunboat Hatteras was at anchor off Galveston, in company with the fleet under command of Commodore Bell, one of Farragut's favorites, and most trusted lieutenants. Suddenly the distinguishing pennant of the Hatteras was reported flying from the flagship Brooklyn, quickly followed by a signal to chase a sail to the southward and eastward. In a few moments the Hatteras was steaming with all possible speed in the direction indicated. All hands were on deck, everybody on the quiver, in high spirits at the prospect of possibly making some prize money. After some time the strange sail could be seen from the deck of the pursuing vessel, which was ascertained to be a steamer. The fact was at once communicated to the flagship by signal.

The Hatteras had formerly been a merchant steamer, known as the Saint Mary, and transferred into the national service in consideration of the sum of \$110,000. She was about 1,100 tons, 210 feet in length and 84 feet beam. Neither in build, strength, speed nor armament was she fitted to engage a regular man-of-war. The heaviest guns she carried were short thirty-two pounders, in addition to which were two thirty-pounder Parrot rifles, one twenty-pounder rifle and one howitzer. She carried in all eight guns. Her machinery was exposed, and her frame was too slight to endure the explosion of heavy shells.

At first the Hatteras did not gain perceptibly upon the stranger, but as the sun declined in the west, and the shadows of the fleeting twilight darkened the waters, it became apparent to all on board that from some cause or other the unknown steamer was rapidly losing ground. Capt. Blake passed the quarter-deck of his vessel silently and plunged in a deep reverie. He was satisfied that deception was being practiced, from the fact that at first the chase easily maintained her distance, and never deliberately allowed the cruiser to approach.

It was near 7 o'clock and quite dark when it was observed that the steamer had stopped her engines, and was lying broadside to waiting the Hatteras.

When within speaking distance - about seventy yards - Blake halted her, "What ship is that?"

"Her Britannic majesty's ship Vixen!" was the quick response. Lieutenant Commander Blake replied that he would send a boat aboard, and immediately gave the order. In the mean while both vessels were changing their positions, the stranger endeavoring to gain a favorable position for a raking fire.

Almost simultaneously with the piping away of the boat, a hoarse cry came from the deck of the dark, sloop steamer, "We are the Confederate steamer Alabama," and was accompanied by a broadside without further promise or warning.

It was at once replied to by Blake, who, aware of the vulnerable position of his craft and her light measurement, saw that his only chance was to close with the Alabama, and perhaps rid the sea of the marauder by boarding. The Hatteras steamed directly for her antagonist, who knew that he had the gunboat in his power and preferred to fight a safe battle. The superior speed of the Alabama enabled her to maintain a suitable distance, using her heavy guns with terrific effect, and the compl. of Capt. Blake to close was thwarted. The Alabama was maintained at not over thirty yards intervening, and the crack of rifles, carbines and musketry, mingled with the deeper roar of the guns.

At length a shell entered amidships in the hold, setting fire to it, and at the same instant a shell passed through the sick bay, exploding in an adjacent compartment, also producing fire; another entered the cylinder, filling the engine-room and deck with steam, rendering it impossible to maneuver the vessel or to work the pump, upon which the reduction of the fire depended.

With this vessel on fire in two places, by your human power to extinguish, a hopeless wreck upon the water, with her walking beam not away from her axis, and her rudders useless, an active fire was still maintained with the hope of a chance shot disabling the Alabama, while the flash of the guns would serve as a guide to direct the movements of the fleet.

They were seen sixteen miles away, and the Brooklyn, Cayuga and Solota started in the direction where the vivid gleams of light proclaimed the scene of the conflict, but long before they reached the spot, the Hatteras had found a last resting place at the bottom of the ocean; and the "293," so numbered by the English builder to show how many friends he had contributed to fit her out, otherwise the Alabama, had disappeared.

It was soon reported by Blake that the Hatteras had entered the Hatteras at the water line, tearing off entire sheets of iron, and that the water was rushing in, utterly defying every attempt to remedy the evil, and that she was rapidly sinking.

THE SURRENDER. To prevent her from blowing up the magazine was flooded, and this boomed forth in sudden reverberations the reports of the sea guns. It was the token of submission, and the firing of the Alabama ceased. It was easy to see that the Hatteras was sinking, which fact prompted Sumner to proffer aid. To keep the bittered bulk afloat until his crew could be saved, Blake ordered his armament of guns to be thrown overboard. Had he not done so, the Hatteras would have proved the tomb of many a gallant blue jacket. As it was, every living being was saved.

OR for the Sponge Fishers. (Boston Budget.) It is not generally known that the sponge fishers of Florida make considerable use of oil for the purpose of calming the surface of the water. During the greater part of the year the slight ripple on the water is easily overcome by that time-honored device, the water-tube. By the aid of that instrument the fishers easily discern the sponges and hook them up from the bottom. But it is sometimes happens in the spring that the roughness of the sea prevents the handling of both hooks and telescopes. Then the sponger throws a spoonful of oil upon the waves, which produces a calm about his boat as long as his care to drift about with it. The oil preferred by the spongers for this purpose is obtained from the liver of the "nurse" shark. So effective is this oil considered that as much as \$1 a gallon is paid for it.
