FATHER KILLS HIS SON

Fred Hunnell, of Des Moines, Shoots His Son, While Himself Attempting Suicide.

Son Was Trying to Prevent the Tragedy—Revolver is Accidentally Discharged.

The Father Then Cuts His Throat With a Pocket Knife—May Live.

Des Moines, Aug. 8.—Fred Hunnell, a man 48 years of age, a carpenter by occupation, shot and instantly killed his son, Archie, at the residence of the family, a half mile north of Forest avenue and Thirtieth street last evening about 7:30 o'clock.

After Hunnell shot his son he drove everybody away from the house, and when a number of men living in the vicinity attempted to approach the residence, he threatened to shoot them with the pistol with which he had shot his son, and an ugly looking knife.
