LEAGUE SEASON ENDS

The passing of base ball in Chicago is unregretted. The year has been one of dismal failure and the future is no brighter.

Brooklyn captured the pennant. That is ancient history. Hanlon's men had the pennant won over all the route, and the Bostonians were losers.

To begin with the important point, from the magnates' standpoint, the league has managed to make money out of a bad year.

Chicago started with a rush and made a strong bid for the pennant up to the middle of July, when the players became dissatisfied and quit trying to play.

St. Louis started the year with a rush; then slumped, rallied and pushed to the front again, slumped again, and finished at an even keel.



