PLAN A GREAT BANK

New York Bankers Said to Have Projected a Great Financial Institution.

Plan Contemplates Making it Rival the Power of the Bank of England.

Secretary of the Treasury Gage May Be Head of the Great Concern.

New York, Dec. 26.—There is in prospect for this city, according to rumor among bank men, a great financial institution which in this country will rival the power of the Bank of England in Great Britain.

The resources of the Hanover national bank are from \$10,000,000 to \$20,000,000. The National City bank has had out in loans at times as much as \$100,000,000. These two banks alone would form in combination a power whose head would practically control Wall street and the financial destiny of the nation.

CHRISTMAS PACKAGES BURNED.

Fire in the United States Express Office at St. Paul.

St. Paul, Dec. 26.—The transfer office of the United States Express Company on Rosenthal street, near Third, filled with Christmas presents, was partially destroyed by the Saturday night and 3,000 packages were destroyed.

Three employees of the company were in the office checking and sorting packages that had just come in on a train. While removing a box one of the men knocked down a lamp, which broke on the floor, and in an incredibly short time the men were driven from the building. The flames were soon subdued by a chemical, but owing to the character of the goods and the manner in which they were packed in the building, nearly everything was damaged or destroyed.

The crew of the fire insurance patrol was unable to save much of the property. They could not get into the building until the firemen had extinguished the flames, and then there was little to save. The day will take a long time to check up the destroyed property.

There were about 3,000 packages in the building, mostly holiday goods, and destined for points east and west of St. Paul. The building was damaged to the extent of \$300.
