FOR GENERAL STRIKE

Failure to Settle Street Car Strike in St. Louis May Increase Labor Troubles.

Large Number of Unions Signify Willingness to Join a Sympathetic Strike.

Meeting to Be Held Tonight to Perfect Arrangements—Cars Running Today.

St. Louis, May 18.—There was a general mass meeting of the strikers on the St. Louis Transit Company's system last night.

It was decided to continue the fight by every peaceable means at the disposal of the union, and to call upon organized labor of St. Louis to walk out in a general sympathy strike beginning next Saturday.

It looks as if serious trouble were to come. The strikers have issued an appeal to the public asking sympathy and moral aid in winning their cause.

Shortly after 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon the union grievance committee and the Transit company officials again met at the Planter's hotel and continued in session two hours.

The Transit company's officials at this afternoon's conference in turn rejected the counter proposition of its employees, which rested entirely on a clause which calls for the complete retirement of all the old men.

The grievance committee at once left for the West End Coliseum, where the general committee of the strikers' union and practically all the striking employees were assembled in mass meeting.

The point on which we cannot agree," said T. B. Edwards, chairman of the grievance committee, "is the first clause in the proposal made by the St. Louis Transit Company.

President Whitaker said: "The proposal made to T. B. Edwards, chairman of the grievance committee of the union and his associates, is final. I will never consent to the discharge of the men who were employed to take the places left vacant by the strikers."

"Disturbances were reported at a number of points along the lines. J. Richards, motorman, from Cleveland, was shot and probably fatally wounded. John Piek, an employee of the Transit Company, was shot. Crowds upset a wagon containing coffee and lunch for non-union men. No police were in sight.

THE IOWA FIELD MEET

The Inter-Collegiate Meet May 25 Promises to Be a Great Event.

Larger Numbers of Entries For the Different Events Than Ever Before.

Des Moines, May 18.—The state inter-collegiate field meet, to be held in this city May 25, promises to be the largest in the history of the association, and already over 175 entries for the different events have been made.

The state fair grounds will be an ideal place for the meet, and the track in front of the grand stand, where most of the events will take place, is being put in excellent condition.

By their dual meets last Saturday a good line-up was gotten up for the four big schools, Iowa City, Grinnell, Drake and Ames; but the smaller colleges in the state association are an unknown quantity.

Several wagers are already being made by the admirers of the different colleges that their favorite will win the most points. Never before in the history of the state field meet has the outcome been so uncertain.

WILSON'S WORK. Secretary of Agriculture Explains Workings of the Department. Secretary Wilson's address at the industrial exposition at Chattanooga:

"Progress has been made during the last three years in carrying out the instructions of President McKinley that the department of agriculture be made useful to all sections of the country and to all producers in the United States.

"Additional weather bureau stations have been established in the southern cotton states and the western mountain states for the purpose of getting more exact information for the people who are interested in the crops in these localities.

"Experimental exports of selected creamery butter were made to England with the purpose of directing attention to the fine butter produced in this country and gaining information for persons desiring to sell in English markets.

"The department of agriculture has greatly increased, and it is the intention of the department to follow the system of distributing mail in the farming districts with information regarding weather conditions regarded as reasonably satisfactory in a business way as well as otherwise.

"Some interesting and satisfactory experiments in the shipment of eggs, with the same objects in view, have also been conducted. Within a few weeks shipments of sweet potatoes have been made to Great Britain with a view to teaching the people over there the value of that article of food, and also to ascertain the facts regarding practical methods of shipment.
