

BRYAN IS FOR SILVER

The Democratic Leader Declares 16 to 1 Must Be Endorsed in the Platform.

Free Silver, Ratio and All, to Be the Vital Issue in the Campaign.

Vice Presidential Candidates Must Also Be in Accord With His Party.

Lincoln, June 26.—I am at home to stay until after the democratic national convention, perhaps longer.

Mr. Bryan denied statements sent out from Lincoln and Chicago that his plan of campaign had been mapped out and that his speeches would be nearly all made from the porch of his Lincoln home.

Mr. Bryan was asked whether he could say anything in regard to the platform to be adopted at Kansas City.

"No one, of course, can say what language will be used in setting forth the party's principles. But some idea can be obtained as to the general tenor of the platform from the platforms of the state conventions.

"It is equally certain that there will be a strong and definite plank against the trusts. There is also no doubt that the plank against imperialism will be clear and explicit.

"You have refused to discuss the vice presidency heretofore, Mr. Bryan. Is there any truth in the rumor that a vice president will be chosen whose views on the money question will be attractive to those who opposed the ticket in 1896?"

"It is true that I have refused to discuss the vice presidency," replied Mr. Bryan, "and I do not care to do so now further than to say that I assume that the candidate nominated for vice president will be in harmony with the platform.

"No man worthy to be considered for such an office would accept a nomination upon a platform repugnant to his views on any important issue. In every campaign men support a ticket without approving all of the platform, but no one can defend a platform unless he believes in it.

"Many tariff reform gold democrats supported the republican ticket four years ago, although they dissented from the protection plank. But the republican convention would not have nominated a tariff reformer upon a protection platform.

Today Mr. Bryan will supervise the harvesting of the five acre field of wheat on his farm.

COCKRAN TO STUDENTS Momentous Consequences Sure to Follow Court's Decision on Porto Rico Law.

New Haven, Conn., June 26.—W. Bourke Cockran addressed the graduating class of the Yale law school at the anniversary exercises.

"Should the supreme court decide that the constitution applies to newly-acquired islands and that their products and their people have free access to our shores, to our ports and to our marts of trade, both political parties will be as earnest in their desire to be rid of them as our party already seems to be," said Mr. Cockran.

"The United States' rights to take territory is not disputed. The annexation of Canada is a wish of many Americans. The annexation of Mexico is not an improbability, nor the taking in of South America an impossibility.
