Corn Followed Wheat But Better Cable News Steadied the Prices.

Hogs Active and Stronger-Cattle Steady-Sheep Steady-Lambs Lower.

Chicago, Feb. 21.—The tendency to close deals in preparation for tomorrow's holiday on the board reduced the better tone in grains early. May wheat opened a shade higher to 1/4c lower at 78 1/2 to 78 in large northwestern receipts and steady cables.

There was little doing in oats. May opened 1/4 down at 43c and declined to 43c@43 1/2, but later sold at 43c. Provisions were dull but slightly higher on the better hog market.
