SUSPECT FOUL PLAY

Coroner Investigating the Death of An Illegitimate Child at Grafton

ITS DEATH WAS SUDDEN

Demise of the Child of a Young Girl, Daughter of a Worth County Farmer, Subject of An Inquiry by the Authorities—General News of the State.

Special to Times-Republican. Northwood, Iowa, July 25.—Coroner C. A. Hurd, Sheriff G. A. Lee, and County Attorney M. H. Kepler were called to Grafton, a small town in the southeastern part of the county to investigate the sudden and mysterious death of the week-old child of a daughter of Albert Trettin, a prominent farmer living near that town.

MEXICO TO SEIZE MINES

Sensational Disclosures in Which the Callanan Estate Is Involved

CREDITORS MAKE BIG CLAIMS

Jas. L. Callanan Disappears and It Is Claimed That \$300,000 Which He Borrowed Is Due the Creditors—Mines May Be Seized to Satisfy the Claims.

Des Moines, July 25.—Sensational disclosures are imminent in the adjustment of the difficulties which have arisen in Mexico with reference to the foreclosure of the mortgage to secure the bonds of the Mexican National Iron and Steel Company, which owned the iron mines with whose exploitation the late James Callanan and James Leonard Callanan, his nephew, were connected.
