WHEAT CLOSED WEAK

Traders Placed a Generally Bullish Construction on Government Crop Report

CORN EASIER AT THE OPENING

This Was Largely Due to a Decline at Liverpool, and Favorable Weather Reports—Selling by Pit Traders Causes Weakness in Oats—Provisions Quiet, Lard Steady, Ribs Easier.

Chicago, Oct. 11.—Wheat today opened active and strong. Higher prices at Minneapolis, and the general bullish construction placed on the government crop report by traders, were the chief reasons for strength shown.

Corn was easier at the opening chiefly because of a decline of 1/4 at Liverpool, and favorable weather in this country. December opened at 42 1/2 to 43 1/2.

Oats were weak on selling by pit traders, based upon the government report and local receipts in excess of the estimated amount.

Provisions. Trading in provisions was quiet. Lard was steady, on covering by shorts. Ribs were easier on selling by pit traders.

IOWA CORN IS AHEAD

Shows Best Average in Statistics Giving Conditions in Various States

FALLING OFF IN WHEAT SHOWN

Preliminary Estimates Place the Average Quality Slightly Lower Than That of Last Year, at the Corresponding Time—Average of 1905 Yield is Also Smaller, Than in 1905.

Washington, D. C., Oct. 11.—In the report showing the condition of corn on October 1, compiled by the department of agriculture, Iowa corn fields are in the lead. The ten year average is 79.6. The condition in the states named is as follows:

Preliminary returns indicate an oat crop of 83,352,000 bushels, or an average of 31.2 bushels per acre, compared with 31.9 in 1905. The average quality is 82.2, against 82.4 in 1905.
