VINEGAR MEN SOUR

Some of the Manufacturers Say State's Food Law Will Ruin Their Business

"NO COLORING" FATAL CLAUSE

New Law Was Enacted With Knowledge of Its Effect on Certain Grades of Vinegar—Processes by Which Cider and Other Vinegars Are Manufactured—None of Exceeding Purity.

Des Moines, May 14.—It has just been discovered by some of the vinegar men of the state of Iowa that the last legislature enacted an amendment to the pure food law that says: "Vinegar shall be deemed to be adulterated if it contains any added coloring matter."

"It will ruin our business," say some of the vinegar men. "We will have to quit manufacturing vinegar because the people are educated to use only colored vinegar."

The law enacted at the last session introduced by Senator Newberry and known as senate file 318, carries this clause, and that clause is the law in twenty-one other states besides Iowa.

With the entrance of the pure food laws it is up to the thrifty housewife to learn something about the manufacture of foods. This is what the state food and dairy commissioner says, at least. Under the pure food law, an amended last session of the legislature, there are six kinds of vinegars. Most housewives have not known that there were more than two kinds, good and bad.

Another kind of vinegar is that made from grape juice by the same process. It may be said that in all vinegars the process is making that the sugar first turns to alcohol, and then to acetic acid.

Another kind is designated malt vinegar which is made by the same process from barley or other grains. It is made out of sour beer in plain language, and sixth kind is known as designated as spirit vinegar, distilled vinegar or grain vinegar.

The six kinds of vinegar recognized by the pure food law are therefore: Cider vinegar, wine or grape vinegar, malt vinegar, sugar vinegar, glucose vinegar, spirit vinegar.

It is the last named vinegar that is the cheapest to make and is colorless. It looks like water and sometimes cuts manufacturers fool the public by calling it white wine vinegar.

After all there need be no fear of using spirit vinegar or malt vinegar or glucose or sugar vinegar. Cider vinegar is more often made of the culls of apples and apple peels and the like.
