BUILDING AFLAME IN INSTANT

Ephraim Collins, of Des Moines, died at 3:10 this morning of valvular disease of the heart. He was a native of Kentucky, 75 years old, and entered the home May 5, 1905.

At 5:25 Saturday evening heart failure caused the death of Vincent Travis of Colfax, who has been a member

of the home since July 10, 1888 one year after the institution was opened. Mr. Travis served in Company H, Second Pennsylvania Infantry. He enlisted at Wilkesbarre, Dec. 10, 1861, and was discharged at Bermuda Port, Va., Dec. 9, 1864.
