Small Creameries Dealt a Hard Blow by Interstate Commerce Commission

RAIL RATES ARE REDUCED

Small Iowa Creameries Fought Proposed Reduction and Declared Lower Tariffs Would Drive Them Out of Business—Big Creameries Score a Victory.

Washington, Jan. 26.—The fight against a reduction in cream rates on the part of the railroads, in which the creameries of Iowa have taken an active part, has resulted in a victory for the larger, or centralizer, buttermaking establishments.

The matter has been before the interstate commerce commission for many months, and a decision was rendered late yesterday, when the commission decided that rates on cream to Chicago, from Michigan points on the east to Colorado points on the west, are excessive and ordered a material reduction.

The greater portion of the evidence in the case was heard in Chicago. It was proposed by the railroads in September, 1907, to advance the rate on cream about 100 per cent. The smaller creameries favored the proposed increase...
