CATTLE PRICES SOAR. Many Steers Close Twenty-Five Higher Than Monday's Values. HOGS ARE GENERALLY HIGHER. In Some Cases, the Advance Was Over Twenty-five Greater—Light Hogs and Mixed Stuff Sell Better Than Choice Lots—Sheep and Lambs Both Higher.

Chicago, Feb. 10.—Light receipts and prospects for meager offerings for the balance of the week, caused a sharp upturn in prices, in practically all departments of livestock today. Cattle received a substantial boost, many steers closing at 10@15c over prices of the previous session, or 20@25c higher than Monday's values.
