INJURIES PROVE FATAL

JAMES KELLY, INJURED IN RUN-AWAY ACCIDENT AT COLFAX, SUCCEUMS. HAD BEEN UNCONSCIOUS MORE THAN SEVEN DAYS.

Member of Prominent and Wealthy Jasper County Family—Was Dragged Three Blocks and Across Railroad Tracks—Wife and Five Children Survive.

Colfax, April 2.—James Kelly died here today from injuries received in a terrible runaway accident here a week ago last evening. He was dragged through the street for three blocks and across six railroad tracks, his foot being firmly caught in the buggy gears.

AGENT'S DEATH NOT A SUICIDE. J. W. Darby Exonerated From Shortage Charged at Time of Death.

Foster, April 2.—J. W. Darby, agent for the Milwaukee at this place, who was reported to have suicided a short time ago when his body was found alongside the track about a fourth of a mile from the station, and when the story given out that he had been found short in his accounts as agent by the auditor on the rounds of the latter a few days before the death occurred, is now shown to have been entirely blameless in the matter, and developments completely exonerate the unfortunate man.

REVOLVER AND BULLETS FATHER'S CHRISTMAS GIFT

Defense on Cross Examination Bringing Out Evidence of Defendant's Mental Deficiency—Brother Testifies That He Was "Queer" — Witness Turns Tables on Lawyer Markley.

Northwood, April 2.—The state rested its direct case yesterday afternoon about 4 o'clock, concluding with the testimony of Dr. C. A. Hurd, the coroner, who has probably spent more time than any one else, except the county attorney, in working up the state's case.

Dr. Hurd was on the witness stand a good share of the afternoon. Mr. Markley, for the defense, put his thru a rather severe cross-examination. Dr. Hurd was called the 27th of December to hold the inquest, and ordered the post-mortem performed by Drs. Gaesler and McGlone. Sheriff Lee asked him to bring Ed in his rig, and he had a conversation with Ed on the way up.
