FINALLY KILLED HIM

WOMAN WHO ATTEMPTED LIFE OF JULIUS PETERS SUCCEEDS ON SECOND ATTEMPT.

STORY CITY SHOOTING RECALLED BY MURDER

Mrs. Heitsman, Abandoned By Peters, Tried to Kill Him in Presence of Bride—Three Shots Fail to Take Effect—Follows Him to St. Louis and Her Aim is Better.

Special to Times-Republican. Nevada, Feb. 10.—The recent killing in St. Louis of Julius Peters by Mrs. Mae Heitsman, a Lincoln, Neb., woman, recalls an ineffectual attempt that the woman made upon the life of the man in this county on Sept. 3, 1908.

Upon being released after the grand jury had failed to indict her for the attempt upon his life, she made the remark that she would get Peters yet, and the killing of him in the Missouri town last week made her threat good.

Shot Three Times at Him. Peters was a telephone lineman who was working for the Mutual people up at Story City. Some days before the incident happened when he was the victim of the woman's wrath he left Story for a few days and returned with a woman whom he claimed as his bride, saying that he had married her down at Tipton, Iowa.

As the man flew up a neighboring straitway to safety, the woman retraced her steps to the hotel and awaited the coming of the officer. She submitted to arrest and the preliminary was held that forenoon. It was then that she bared the secret of her life. Her name was Mae Heitsman and she was the daughter of highly respected parents. She had become the wife of a saloonkeeper, did not get along well with him and had for some time been separated.

She eventually followed the man whom she insisted had betrayed her trust and had married another woman, to St. Louis, where she killed him outright by shooting him, upon meeting him upon the street. She is now in jail awaiting trial upon a charge of murder.

HELD UP ON HIGHWAY.

Two Masked Men Rob Emerson Youth Special at Dead of Night.

Emerson, Feb. 10.—Heber Hillyer, a young man of this place, was the victim of a holdup Tuesday night. He had passed the evening in the company of a lady friend south of Emerson about 1 o'clock when he was stopped in a lonely place in the road by two masked men, who stepped from behind a clump of trees and took positions on each side of the carriage.

Heber was commanded to hold up his hands, which he quickly did. He was then made to stand up in the carriage and while one of the men kept him covered with a revolver the other went through his clothing. He had only 80 cents in cash, which they took, together with his gold watch and chain.
