The heartbroken parents are unable to account for the tragedy, as they had no knowledge of such tablets being in the house.

Unionville Man Kills Self.

Unionville, Feb. 25.—Charles Hard, aged 40, committed suicide by shooting himself at his home, three miles north of Unionville. Hard had been in ill health for some time. Before he took his life he gave his wife directions as to the disposal of his property, but she merely humored his whim as that of an ailing man rather than one planning suicide.

Pauper Kills Himself.

Carroll, Feb. 26.—Tom Conley, a county charge for many years, committed suicide at the poor farm, three miles north of Carroll, by cutting his throat from ear to ear with a razor. The inquest was held early this last evening. Conley was upwards of 60 years of age and will be remembered by all old residents of the country.

TOO MUCH GOLD AIR

HOTEL MEN COMPLAIN THAT FRESH AIR SLEEPERS FREEZE WATER PIPES.

THEY WOULD LEGISLATE TO RECOVER DAMAGES

White Plague Campaign and the Craze for Outdoor Sleeping and Fresh Air Hits Hotel Men Hard When Windows Are Thrown Wide Open—Prices to Go Up.

At their convention here this week a general complaint was made by hotel men that the fresh air craze going over the country in connection with the tuberculosis campaign was causing them untold grief and damage by the freezing of water pipes in the rooms of occupants who throw their windows wide open.


