SOME ONE HAS MISINFORMED PRESIDENT TAFT AS TO CONDITIONS IN IOWA.

PROGRESSIVES OF STATE FORCED TO TAKE DEFENSIVE

Taft Mailed Into Opposition to Controlling Faction in Iowa and Will Throw His Influence in Favor of Re-election of Hull, Smith and Kennedy—Standpats Rejoice.

Special to Times-Republican. Des Moines, March 8.—That the progressive republicans of Iowa will have to soon defend themselves from the attacks of the organization or suffer complete annihilation is the assertion made yesterday by a prominent progressive who has been watching the trend of affairs.

Dispatches from Washington tell of the conference at the White House Saturday when Congressman McKinley of Illinois, took Hepburn, Kennedy and Smith to the president to secure his approval of the McKinley plan for putting an end to the progressive movement in the west.

The dispatches indicate that it was represented to Taft that there was going to be a bitter factional fight in Iowa, that the Iowa progressives, who two years ago were unanimous for Taft, are planning to denounce him and to fight him in office, and that the only friends he has are the old standpatters.

The dispatches further indicate that Taft has agreed to give his support to the plan of McKinley to abandon all progressives who may happen to be nominated and to withhold from them any support for election after the primaries, to, in short, elect democrats in preference to any republicans.

Some One Has Lied to Taft. "This thing looks peculiar to me," said one of the men who has been making a little study of the matter.

Who McKinley Is. Congressman McKinley of Champaign, Ill., who is in charge of the campaign to save "the organization" and has taken personal charge of the fight in Iowa, as indicated in the Washington dispatches, recently made a bold effort to get control of the Des Moines street car company and with it over 1,000 votes in the Seventh congressional district.

MAYOR'S SON HOLD-UP VICTIM. Leroy Robeson of Bettendorf Robbed and Thrown in Ditch.

Davenport, March 8.—Leroy Robeson of Bettendorf, son of Mayor Edward Robeson, was the victim of a hold-up home on the Jersey Ridge road. Two men, neither of whom wore a mask and neither with a gun, accosted him at a lonely spot on this road and demanded that he turn over his valuables.

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MABRAY GANG SCARED

REPORT PERSISTS THAT LEADER WILL ASK FOR MERCY OF COURT.

PLEAS OF GUILTY EXPECTED FROM MANY OF MABRAY PALS

Mabray and His Associates Seem to Fear Revelations Sure to Be Developed in Trial—Mabray to Be Arraigned for Trial at Council Bluffs Thursday—Witnesses Assembling.

Special to Times-Republican. Council Bluffs, March 8.—Rumors current for some time that J. C. Mabray, alleged and acknowledged leader in the so-called swindle syndicate, to be arraigned for trial in this city Thursday, will plead guilty, are again heard with greater persistency and accompanied by an air of probability.

It is known positively that the government attorneys and officials expect pleas of guilty from a number of the defendants. It was stated today by Prosecuting Attorney M. L. Temple, that tentative pleas looking to a plea of guilty by Mabray, the chief defendant, had been discussed by the federal officials.

Fear Court Revelations. In addition to the fact that to plead guilty may result in a lighter sentence, there are other reasons given for a motive in the case. It is well known that desperate efforts have been made to prevent the federal government securing promises of pleas of guilty from other of the indicted men, by Mabray and leaders in the alleged swindle syndicate.

Many Witnesses in City. Nearly 100 witnesses, attorneys and

others interested in the forthcoming trial have arrived in the city. The first of the victims of the syndicate, who are to form the principal witnesses in the case, to arrive, was E. G. Allsbaugh, of Terre Haute, Ind., who arrived Monday night. James Alward of South Bend, Ind., another important witness in the case, was among the first to arrive. Deputy United States marshals with indicted men in tow, are enroute here from every point of the compass and by Wednesday night every train is expected to bring others of the little army of witnesses and defendants who are to appear.

VALUABLE RUG RECOVERED. Oriental Furnishing Found in Possession of Bluffs Man.

Council Bluffs, March 7.—A valuable oriental rug, said to be worth between \$175 and \$200 was recovered by Detective Gillaspie of the police department, Friday evening and will be returned to the owners, Orchard & Wilhelm Furniture Company, of Omaha.

After making an investigation the detective decided that the rug was some place in the city. Friday night Minnick confessed to Detective Gillaspie that he could take him to the place where the rug was, and pointed out Osborn's rooms. Osborn claims that he bought the rug from Minnick for \$12 and that he paid him \$2 down on it. Minnick says this is not true. He says the rug was stolen from his wagon but that he does not know who stole it.

It seems that the three were going up stream in a small row boat until they came to a large bend in the river, when the other two boys left the boat to cut across on land, leaving Cunningham to row the boat alone.
