JONES FAIRLY BUBBLES OVER WITH GENEROSITY

Offers Lower Rate on Lights and Power—Mayor Explains Proposition to Buy—Hull Ordinances Put on Second Reading—Hull Raps Street Cars—Jones Presents High Rates For Comparison.

The council spent Tuesday night in a discussion of the new Hull ordinances on gas, electricity and street car service, and all were placed on their second reading.

The mayor presented his tentative plan for municipal ownership, but made no definite announcement as to what price he expected to get on the plant.

The Mayor's Negotiations. In telling of his plans the mayor said that he was now engaged in figuring out the deal for purchase on an arbitrary basis, and he expected, within a few days, to call the council together.

Good and Herman wanted to hear from President Jones, but Psenicka thought not, claiming that as long as the mayor was negotiating with the company it was not advisable to make the plan too public.

Herman thought that Jones should give the public some idea as to the price he wanted. "Let the people do a little thinking for themselves," said Herman.

Gas Ordinance Called. The Hull gas ordinance was then called up on its second reading. In the debate Clark objected to any further action on the ordinance that would repeal any action now pending in the federal court.

The mayor asked what would be the result in the event that no agreement was reached with Jones & Hovey as to purchase. "Why lose the time it takes to get into the federal court?" he asked.

Northrup Willing to Assist. City Attorney F. E. Northrup said that if there were any other attorneys in Marshalltown who wanted to take up the city's case without charge he would cooperate with them.

The question of the attorneys donating their services being an advantage in the new cases, called for a statement by the mayor that both Mr. Car-

ney and Mr. Van Law had received enough from the city so that they ought to donate something.

In view of the discussion Gregory suggested that the council think the situation over until next Monday night, the date fixed as the adjournment.

Electric Light Ordinance. The Hull electric light ordinance was then called, and placed on its second reading.

The towns selected, however, were all high rate towns favorable to the company, and Mr. Gregory said, the matter of rates was much like expert testimony—it made a difference from whom it was secured.

Jones & Hovey's Propositions. The written proposition of Jones & Hovey, as made to the council, is as follows: Rates for gas—Will allow a discount of 10 cents per thousand cubic feet for prompt payment on or before the 10th of the month, beginning July 1.

Electricity for lighting—The present net rates for electricity are 14 cents for the first two kilowatts per lamp installed, and 7 cents for all over two kilowatts.

Street Car Ordinance. Following the power ordinance, which was not discussed, the street car ordinance was placed on its second reading.

The street car company has given the mayor authority to repair the car line on North Third street. The idea of the city is to clean out the tracks alongside the track, and grout in with concrete.
