GAS CASE IS READY

CEDAR RAPIDS MOVES TO HAVE SUPREME COURT DISMISS WRIT OF ERROR.

ARGUMENTS TO BE PRESENTED IN WASHINGTON JUNE 13

Unless Supreme Court Dismisses Writ City Will Ask That Case Be Advanced for Immediate Consideration—Confident Writ Will Be Dissolved.

Cedar Rapids, May 20.—Attorneys for the city have completed their briefs for submission to the United States supreme court, asking that body to dismiss the writ of error by the Cedar Rapids Gas Company, and also to affirm the decision of the state supreme court that the 50-cent rate is compensatory and fair.

The city's attorneys ask for the dismissal of the writ of error on the ground that the question at issue involves no federal question within the meaning of the statutes conferring power upon the supreme court to grant a writ of error to a state court. Also that the facts found by the Iowa supreme court are final and conclusive, and the federal court has no power to revise facts.

DROGGED ROAD ACROSS IOWA ASSURED AS A RESULT

Committee on General Organization Selected and Enthusiastic Addresses Made—Many Autoists From Towns Along C. & N. W. Present—Banquet in the Evening.

Boone, May 20.—The transcontinental road convention which was held in this city yesterday has started something. The Clinton-Bluffs people are not going to be outdone by anybody and have accepted a movement which will give the recognized blue book route across the continent the best stretch of dirt road in the state.

John L. Goepfinger was the chairman of the meeting and George Brunten secretary. W. C. Rollins, who in a measure started this river-to-river movement, was made permanent chairman.

Elchinger, of Des Moines, one of the river-to-river good roads workers, missed connections on account of the very poor interurban service between Boone and Des Moines, and therefore the convention had to be content in the afternoon with the following telegram from him: "Come!
