STANDPATS BEGGING

MAKE FIRST ADMISSION THAT THEY WILL NOT CONTROL STATE CONVENTION. LAFE YOUNG IN PLEA FOR DIVISION IN POLK

Begs Progressives to Concede Them Twenty Delegates—Some of the Old Machine Men Don't Like to Be Counted Out—Kuehnle Declares War Against Dolliver.

Des Moines, June 27.—Perhaps the first authentic confession on the part of the standpats that they realize fully that they stand no show of control of the August state convention unless by free and voluntary gift of the progressive republicans, was contained in their local organ here Saturday.

For some time it has been known that efforts were being made to compel the Polk county republicans to abandon their hard earned victory at the polls. A systematic stream of abuse has been poured out upon the heads of various named republicans who have assisted in making the fight. This not proving of any avail, the Jackson crowd is now begging for mercy, and votes.

For some time the special object of attack on the part of the standpat organ here has been Charles Bradshaw, who had the good sense to see to it that a sufficient number of his friends were placed on the delegations to make certain his nomination as district judge. But the real reason is that Mr. Bradshaw is and long has been a warm personal friend of Cummins and Prouty.

Hon. Gerrit Klav, of Sioux City, will probably be a candidate for speaker of the next Iowa house. He is one of active leaders of the Iowa house and in hearty sympathy with the majority opinion in the republican party.

Governor Carroll hastened to send a letter of congratulations to his old neighbors in Davis county over the vote they gave him and the splendid manner in which he was endorsed there. He complimented them in the fact as reported to him, that he had received 90 per cent of the vote of the county and in two townships every vote. The same issue of his old newspaper at Bloomfield also disclosed the fact that the republicans failed to nominate either a candidate for auditor, recorder, coroner, superintendent or surveyor, but that an effort is to be made to ignore the primary law and make these nominations by the county convention. The paper also came out strongly opposed to the primary system saying:

"No better men are selected for office and proper expression of choice renders itself into a farce. The old township caucus, county and state convention system came as near representing the will of the people as the primary."

BAD FACTORY FIRE

MANUFACTURING PLANTS AT DAVENPORT TOTALLY DESTROYED; LOSS \$300,000. BRAMMER PLANT ONE OF LARGEST OF ITS KIND

Washing Machine Concern Loses \$200,000—Slaughtering Company's Plant Also Burned, and Artificial Ice Factory Damaged—Adjoining Stores and Dwellings Burned.

Davenport, June 27.—A \$300,000 fire Sunday afternoon completely destroyed the plants of the Brammer Manufacturing Company and the Davenport Slaughter and Rendering Company, and partially destroyed the plant of the Tri-City Plate Ice Company, as well as several stores and dwellings.

The Brammer Manufacturing Company had one of the largest washing machine factories in the world. The flames leveled it to a barren waste, entailing a loss of \$200,000. The fire, which started in the ice plant from a spark from a passing locomotive, raged during a fierce wind storm, and for a time the entire west end of the city was threatened with destruction.
